Records Fall As Racing Meet Closes

Track Trotting Mark Is Broken; Hilda Budlong Sets New Mar. Record

Sensational And Fast Racing Witnessed As Old Home Week Racing Is Concluded Yesterday.

Record smashing performances to a record-smashing meet climaxed the Old Home Week harness racing program yesterday as the track trotting record went by the boards under the flying hoofs of Alloway, former American star in both the second and third heats of the Free-for-All Trot and the Mar-bred two year old pacing mare went into the discard as Wilbur Lawless' Hilda Budlong paced the second mile of the Futurity in 2:20 1-4 to create a new record for the future two-year-olds to shoot at. Expected to be the best day's racing of the four day meet nevertheless the big crowd of racing fans had little idea that they would be in for the performances staged yesterday. Over a lightning-fast track—yesterday as fast as any in Eastern Canada—the trotters and pacers in every class had the packed stands on their feet almost all the time from the first heat as upsets, blanket finishes, thrilling and sensational stretch duels and record-breaking performances were made before their eyes. One knew not what to expect next as the meet closed in a blaze of glory with the fans standing on their feet hoarse with excitement as Dudy Patch, springing an upset, came through in the stretch to win the 2:14 Trot and Pace in a heat that closed out the most thrilling and spectacular racing meet staged here in a great many years.

A Great Race

Finishing only third in the first heat of the Free-for-All Trot the favored Alloway in his two record breaking performances in the next two heats showed plainly why he was so highly regarded. As he neared the pole on the first turn of the second heat the horse was really flying as he took his field down to the half in 1:02 3-4, and completed the mile by going the last half in 1:05 to set up the new mark of 2:07 3-4. Then not content with that one great performance the son of McGregor the Great came on to trot halves of 1:03 1-2 and 1:04 1-2 in the third mile to again clip the record.

Half Brother to Heatherbell

And ironically enough it was a half-brother to the former holder of the popular Heatherbell that displaced the mark. Heatherbell, by the same sire established his mark in September, 1936 when driven by L. Col. D. A. MacKinnon and won the same race in the second heat of the first half of the first heat of the third and final heat. That is really racing that would be hard to duplicate at any place where the harness horses gather.

New Maritime Mark

Wilbur Lawless' smooth-pacing two year old Hilda Budlong showed words of ability and promise as she accounted for the other new record set up yesterday. Winner of the first heat of the Futurity in 2:24 the Sempile-driven mare opened all out in the second heat to negotiate the mile in 2:20 1-4 and appeared that with competition might be able to even lower the mark a bit further.

Two-Year-Old Futurity Trot

First Heat: The "babies" got away on the second score with Lusty First at the pole followed by Dorothy Abelle, Kelly's Nightmare and Willard McDonald's Wait N'See had a battle for third place with the former getting the pole by half a length. Miss Brewster went fourth, Kelly's Nightmare fifth, and Willard's Wait N'See sixth. The mile was in 2:28.

Second Heat: They got away on the first score with Lusty First on the pole. Lusty went to a break by Dorothy Abelle took the pole with Wait N'See third, Kelly's Nightmare fourth and Miss Brewster fifth. Coming by the first half mile, Lusty first settled down again, went to the front. Dorothy Abelle

Free-For-All Trot Purse \$500

First Heat: The big field of trotters after getting away on the first score gave the crowd the first thrill of the afternoon as Millie Kalmuck was beaten by inches by Hal Britton in a driving blanket finish with the mile in 2:09 3-4. Dudy Potempkin went away on the pole and kept the heavy-chirring crowd Millie slowly crept up on the living leader only to lose the decision by not less than six inches. It was another upset. In the racing men's minds, and close was the finish that the drivers of Hal Britton and Millie Kalmuck both came back to the stand before the Britton horse was announced as the winner. Alloway who raced the mile on the outside all the way was third with Harvest Melody fourth and the remainder of the field fighting neck and neck for the other positions.

First Heat: It was a sensational mile from wire to wire with Aaron L. and Dudy Patch staging a duel that was never equalled here. Dudy snapped the pole at the first turn and held it to the wire the first trip around. Aaron L. racing on the outside of Dudy passed the Patch horse at the stands and went into the pole at the first turn followed by Dudy with San Tan on the outside. Going up the back stretch San Tan dropped back and the three horses raced in single file to the three

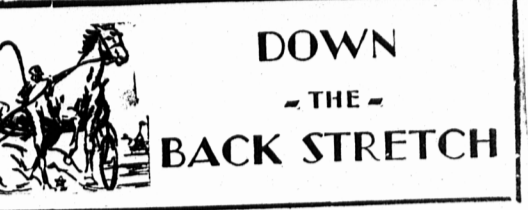

High-flying Reds Snap Out Of Slump To Beat Cubs Twice

NEW YORK, Aug. 16—(AP)—De-feated in a squeeze finish in the first game of a doubleheader today by Pittsburgh Pirates, 6-5, St. Louis Cardinals roared back to take the nightcap of a National League game at St. Louis 9-5 in a slam-bang battle which saw each team collect 11 hits.

The high-flying Cincinnati Reds snapped out of their long hitting slump at Chicago, banging out 26 hits off four pitchers for a double victory over Chicago Cubs 9-4 and 6-2.

The Reds, whose first-place margin had slipped from nine to five games in recent weeks, collected 13 hits in each game as they handed the Cubs their seventh loss in their last nine games. Cincinnati tagged big Bill Lee with his 14th mound defeat of the season in the second game, relief pitcher Johnny Hutchings getting credit for his first big league decision.

Whitely Moore was ahead of the Cubs all the way in the first game, shutting them out until the eighth inning when Hank Leiber connected for a two-run homer, his 14th of the season. The Cubs added two more in the ninth, but Moore easily re-secured the side before the threat became serious.

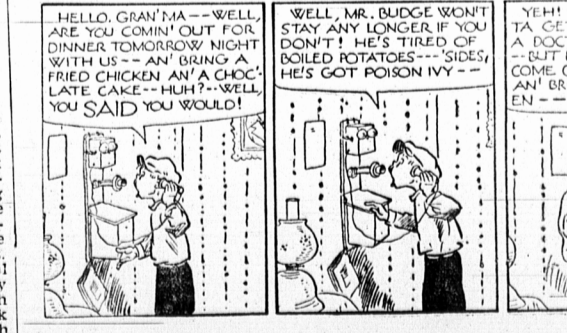
