NEW U. S. CONSUL ARRIVES.—The new American Consul for Charlottetown, Mr. C. Ludlow Livingston and Mrs. Livingston with their daughter, Miss Livingston, and sons Carroll and Brookhous Livingston, arrived in the city on Wednesday night, from New York to take up their residence here. They are stopping for the present at the Victoria. As announced recently, Mr. Livingston is a native of New York City. He is a graduate of Fordham University and the West University of Pennsylvania Law School. He practiced law several years and held various state positions in Pennsylvania. He entered the Foreign Service in 1915 and has served as United States Consul at Salina Cruz, Mexico, Swansea, Wales; was detailed at Liverpool; and has served as Consul at Barbados, British West Indies, for the past five years. 
