Will Photograph and Record Bird Calls

BRUNSWICK, Maine, June 7-(CP)-An expedition conducted under the auspices of Bowdoin College and with the assistance and co-operation of Cornell, Harvard, and other American Universities as well as the Canadian Government, will start work this month on Kent's Island, N. B., in the Bay of Fundy. The Island will be used for a base for the varied scientific missions of the expedition.

The expedition under the direction of William A. O. Gross, of Bowdoin University, will attempt from their Island base to record the calls of various rare birds by radio and sound film. The calls will be picked up first by a sensitive Microphone, equipped with a reflecting mirror, which will be sensitive to sounds within a half mile.

The calls will then be carried over a long cable to a shortwave transmitter, then recorded on film on a sound truck 60 miles away. This branch of the work will be under the direction of Albert R. Brand of Cornell University.

Among the equipment used on the expedition will be a seaplane furnished by Adriel U. Bird, Bowdoin Alumnus. The plane will be used to make an aerial map of the Island and surrounding district, which has never been mapped topographically. The flight operations will be directed by Bradford Washburn, of Harvard. Weather observations, especially fog and tide phenomena in the Bay of Fundy, sea temperatures and other oceanographic features will be carried on by Newell Gilbert, with the co-operation of Harvard Observatory.

Meanwhile ornithological data will be collected from the Colony of Herring Gulls on the Island, along with studies of the Elder Ducks, Razor-Billed Auk, Guillemots, and other wild fowl. Many of the migratory specimens will be banded to assist in the study of their pilgrimages.

One of the first tasks of the Scientists when they reach the Island will be the installation of a modern short-wave transmitter which will probably be heard around the world under favorable conditions. It is licensed by the Canadian Government under the Letters Velin. Mr. Gross also announced additions to the station which will soon bring the total of the station's housing facilities to five buildings, including a complete Laboratory and living quarters for a staff of 25.
