STEFANSEN'S POLARSHIP ARRIVES AT NOME.

NOME, Alaska, July 10.—The Canadian polar exploration ship Karluk arrived from Victoria yesterday with twelve of the scientists who will go with Vilhjalmur Stefansson into the Arctic. Four hours later the steamship Victoria arrived from Deatle with Stefansson, Dr. R. M. Anderson, his lieutenant, and James Murray, oceanographer. The expedition will remain until July 20th, when the way will be open to Point Barrow, the northernmost point of Alaska, while her supplies will be transferred to the auxiliary boat Alaskan, which will make the southern port under Dr. Anderson from Nome to Victorialand for scientific research work.

READY FOR GRAND PRIX RACE.

PARIS, July 11.—Hundreds of automobile enthusiasts left the capital today and journeyed northward to be on hand for the Grand Prix, the most important of the European road races, that is to be run on the nineteen-mile circuit near Amiens tomorrow. The race this year promises to be as speedy and as spectacular as the similar contests in the past. The leading makes of cars of France, England and Italy will be represented in the contest. The cars will be piloted by the best drivers in Europe, among them George Boillot, who won the race last year.

OBTAIN A NECK OF BEAUTY

(By a Physician)

A beautiful neck is a distinct charm of the possessor and a pleasure to the beholder.

Tall, stiff, thick collars are a direct menace to this beauty. The ideal neck is most readily obtained and retained by those who wear collarless dresses, or, if a covering for the neck is essential, use transparent materials of white or lined with white.

This necessity of careful attention to neckwear and neckbands should be carried even to the underwear.

Often a ribbon is drawn through underwear where it exerts a pressure that is not only bad for the contour of the neck but affects circulation.

This point should be remembered in dressing a child as well as in the woman's own toilette.

An equally important essential in beautifying the neck, is to keep it thoroughly clean. To cleanse the skin scrub the neck with hot water and the best imported castile soap obtainable.

The hot water cleanses, but it also tends to loosen the neck muscles and make the skin flabby. The cold water tightens the skin, hardens the muscles and is one of the best aids to keeping the double chin at a distance and the lined neck in the background.

Some women are such strong believers in the cold water beautifier that they use ice-water, and ice pack for as much as ten minutes at a time.

This cold treatment undoubtedly tones and tightens the skin imparting a brilliancy to it after being relaxed from the hot scrub.

THE POPE'S HEALTH IS SATISFACTORY.

AN INTERESTING MURDER TRIAL IN RUSSIA.

KIEFF, Russia, July 10.— Counsel for the Jew Bellies, accused of the murder of a little boy for ritualistic purposes, asked yesterday that subpoenas be issued calling for eighty-nine new witnesses, mostly Christians, including many distinguished theologians and professors, and the court surgeon. Dr. Payloff, owing to the divergence of opinion among medical experts as to the nature of the wounds inflicted on the boy, Bellies' counsel also requests the production of certain Hebrew books relating to ritual murders cited by the Roman Catholic priest Pranasitis, in his efforts to show that the death of the boy was due to library.
