### AN ANGLO-SAXON CANADIAN EMPIRE

An interesting Lecture on What Canada Will be Like in 1999 Some Facts And Figures by a Student of The Subject.

St. CATHARINES, Dec. 1.—An Anglo-Saxon Canadian empire was the keynote of Rev. Byron R. Staffer's address on "Canada in 1999" before the Canadian Club here recently. Mr. Staffer, who is pastor of Grace Methodist Church, Buffalo, N. Y., is a native of Buffalo, Ontario. As he lives in a section of Buffalo in which the foreign element predominates, his views on immigration were received with interest. That problem he said, which is the present dilemma of the United States, will soon perplex Canada. A million foreigners a year flock to the shores to the republic. Five years ago the annual influx was half a million. In five years more it can easily be two millions. Three-quarters are of the Slav and Latin races. At present, fourteen millions of foreign births and forty millions of foreign percentage are in the country. Thirty years ago three-quarters of the annual total came from Britain, Germany or Scandinavia. To-day, four-fifths come from Russia, Italy and Australia. Only 7 per cent of all immigrants landing at New York speak English. The future promises a heterogeneous America, controlled by those who rovere no Sa bath, brook no abstinence sentiments, know no Saxon respect for law, and possess no high political ideals.

The future of Canada is bound up in this all-consuming question of the immigrant. If the Canada of 1999 will be Anglo Saxon, the greatest problem of her destiny will have been solved. If her reinforcements continue to come from the British Isles, the great territory of the west and north will be filled with the homes of God-fearing, Sabbath-keeping, law-abiding people. But if her new citizens be Babes of Slavians and Latins and Orientals, Anglo-Saxon civilization may perish in the western world, as the ancient culture of Greece and Italy crumbled before the advance of the vandals of the north. Greed should not be allowed to frame the policy that create the quality of the blood of the great-grandchildren of Canadians. With proper care Canada will continue to be the parlor of the continent.

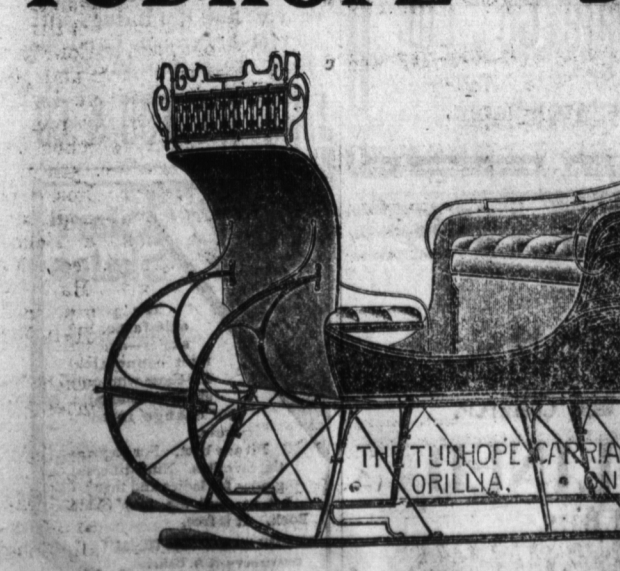
