The record for six days' riding—142 hours—is 2,738 miles. This is an average of about nineteen and one-third miles an hour phenomenal speed when it is considered human legs are the only motive power. The record run of an ocean greyhound from Sandy Hook to Queenstown, a distance of 2,900 miles is five days, seven hours and twenty-three minutes. This run was made by the Lusitania of the Cunard line. With her enormous power and wonderful machinery she only averages twenty-two miles an hour.
