Big Aluminum Plant Possible In West Africa

By Sydney Gampell
 LONDON, Nov. 17 (Reuters)—Great potential importance tonight was attached in informed quarters to an announcement that Aluminum Company of Canada has acquired a share interest in West-African Aluminum, Limited.

If this bears fruit, it will mean that the sterling-area aluminum smelter, costing anything up to \$100,000,000, will be built in West Africa and will be an all-commonwealth job.

West-African Aluminum is a subsidiary of the important South-African mining finance house, the Evening Star, Consolidated Investment Company, Limited.

West-African Aluminum, a company incorporated in the Gold Coast colony, holds certain concessions of bauxite properties, hydro-electric sites and other rights in that territory.

It is understood that a British Government mission is going to the Gold Coast to investigate the hydro-electric prospects on the Volta River and its tributaries. This has already been investigated commercially.

If a dam were put up for irrigation and to improve navigation, it would be a further long step towards opening up the Gold Coast. Some major work would be required for the hydro-electric industry from the dam. Aluminum needs more power than any other industry.

It is thought that an aluminum smelter must be built somewhere in the sterling area to save dollars. At present Britain and other sterling countries have to get most of their aluminum from Canada and pay dollars for it.

Britain's current contract for Canadian aluminum has had to be cut in half since it is from the end of this year to the end of next March.

At one time it was conjectured that Anglo-Transvaal, through its American connections (Kennecott Copper) might enlist the technical knowledge and backing of United States aluminum interests. It is thought here that this matter might have been affected by the recent death of an air crash in Quebec of three heads of Kennecott.

Today's announcement implied that Anglo-Transvaal has decided to team with the Canadians as regards aluminum.
