JAPANESE MAKE GOOD PROGRESS

In Port Arthur Siege, Wolf Hill Captured

Kuroki Reports His Latest Victory Important—Russian Cruise Stops British Steamer.

PROGRESS OF FORT ARTHUR SIEGE. LONDON, Aug. 9.—(Special)—General Stoessel in command at Port Arthur confirms the previous reports that the Japanese have captured Wolf Hill.

SEVENTY THOUSAND BESIEGERS. He estimates the number of Japanese before Port Arthur at seventy thousand men.

STOPPED IN THE ATLANTIC. The steamer Manora reports she was stopped by a Russian cruiser off Cape Fin Terré (the most westerly part of Spain.)

KUROKI'S GREAT VICTORY. Gen. Kuroki reports that his victory over the Russians, July 31, was the most important since the war began as the forces engaged were more numerous. There is no fresh word from the front today.



RUSSIAN RETREAT TO NEW CHWANG.

The Russians had ordered all European troops out of New Chwang, as the advent of the Japanese was expected at any hour. This was done ostensibly to save the Europeans from hardships which are near the town, and are said to be certain to meet before the Japanese after the retreating Russians. The latter seem to be developing into the same class of fighters as the Boers proved to be—superb in defence and capable of wonderful retreats. The retreat here shown was one in which great courage was displayed by the Russians, who bravely turned time and time again to charge the advancing Japanese. The latter, however, do not seem anxious to come to a big battle at this time. The plan of Gen. of Staff of Kodama now seems to be to pull all of Kuroki's forces into a small area near Mukden, so that one big fight can settle the whole war game. In this the Japanese have been working out with the precision of well-oiled machinery.

EARTHQUAKE IN NEW ZEALAND

Severest in Many Years Occurred Yesterday

Lisbon also Shaken About Same Time—Buildings Seriously Damaged, but People Escaped.

NEW ZEALAND BADLY SHAKEN.

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND, Aug. 9.—(Special)—The heaviest known earthquake in New Zealand in many years occurred this morning.

NO LIVES LOST, BUILDINGS DAMAGED. Several public buildings were seriously damaged and private firms also suffered but no loss of life is reported.

LISBON ALSO HAS A SHOCK. LONDON, Aug. 9.—(Special)—A slight earthquake was felt here but no damage done.

The shock was practically simultaneous with that in New Zealand, taking into account the difference in time.

CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES ARE NECK AND NECK

In the Seawanhaka Cup Races—Each Boat Has Scored Two Wins.

MONTREAL, Aug. 9.—(Special)—In the Seawanhaka Yacht Race today White Bear, the American yacht, won by a minute over Noora, the Canadian boat. The first race was won by the Noora on Friday by 4 min. and 55 seconds, the second on Saturday by the White Bear by 53 sec. which was lost by the Canadian yacht owing to a broken tiller. The third race on Monday went to the Noora by nearly four minutes and the result yesterday is given above. Each of these now two races and the deciding one will be sailed today.

WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY PROMISED

BOTH ORDERS GROWING. Large numbers are attending and the reports indicate satisfactory growth and progress in both orders.

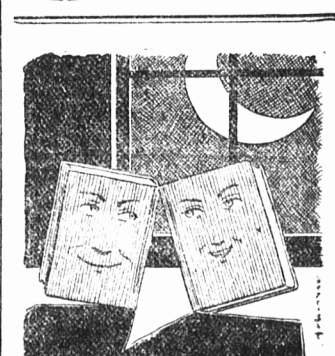
MOOSE INSPECTS ST. JOHN. A full grown cow moose wandered about the streets for some hours till it was captured and taken back to the woods and liberated.
