Abandonment of Imperial Preferences

CAPE TOWN, April 8.—The abandonment of the present Imperial Tariff Preferences was announced by N. C. Havenga, Minister of Finance, in the Budget brought down in the House of Assembly today. The Budget statement, however, outlined a readjustment of the British Preferences on a quid pro quo basis under which British goods will benefit to the extent of £300,000 and the Dominions to the extent of £50,000 as compared with £86,000 and £90,000 respectively formerly. The budget also restores penny postages in the Union.

in Prince County, make application for rebate on his gasoline tax? If so, has the same been considered and has any rebate been made; if not, why not?" Hon. Mr. McDonald replied that a statement would be prepared.

Mr. Buntain asked the Minister of Public Works if he had received a petition from the residents of North Rustico asking for a continuance of the improved highway to North Rustico, and if so, what are the intentions of the Government in regard to same, also if he had received a petition from the residents of Mayfield asking for an improved road from New Glasgow Mills to Cavendish, and what are the intentions of the Government in the matter, also if he had received a petition from the residents of Mayfield asking for an improved road from New Glasgow Mills to Cavendish, and what are the intentions of the Government in the matter, Hon. Mr. McDonald replied that the petitions referred to had been received, and that both would receive consideration after definite information had been obtained.

Mr. McEwen asked the Minister of Public Works: "(1) Is it the intention of the Government to complete the work commenced last year on the road leading from Peake's Road to Morell Station, known as Bryne's Road? (2) Is it the intention of the Government to repair the South end of St. Patrick's Road, including the bridge thereon? (3) Is it the intention of the Government this summer to construct a highway project from Mt. Stewart to Morell Rear Chapel via Head of Hillsborough." Hon. Mr. McDonald replied that each of these roads would be looked after.

Hon. Mr. Stewart presented "The Appropriation Act, 1925-6." The bill was read a first time. Hon. Mr. Prowse presented a report of the committee on printing, to the effect that the tender of the Commercial Publishing Company for printing the Journal of the Assembly, being the lowest, be accepted. The report was adopted.

Hon. Dr. McMillan presented the report of the Provincial Librarian. On motion of Mr. J. Augustine McDonald the bill to incorporate the Superior Drug Company (Ltd.) was read a second time and committed Mr. Hunter in the chair. The bill was reported, agreed to.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Stewart the bill respecting "An Interprovincial Home for Young Women" was read a second time and committed, Mr. Hunter in the chair.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Stewart the bill entitled "The Succession Act, 1925," was further considered in Committee, Mr. Maynard McDonald in the chair. The bill was reported agreed to with amendments.

Afternoon Sitting

On motion of Hon. Mr. McNeill, the bill to amend "The Summerside Incorporation Act, 1903," was read a second time and committed, Mr. J. B. McDonald in the chair. This bill authorizes the town to borrow \$50,000 by the issue of debentures, payable on the 15th of June, 1945, bearing interest at the rate of not more than five per cent. It also sets forth that no person or persons, firm or corporation, shall hereafter use, or cross any of the streets of Summerside for the purpose of running any wire or cable for conducting electrical current within the town without the consent of the town council. Further, it enacts that the Town Council may make such by-laws as they may deem necessary for the efficient management of their electric lighting system, the sale of electrical current and the collection of amounts due for the same. It also provides that "no Justice of the Peace nor any two or more Justices of the sitting or acting together or any person having the power or authority of two or more Justices of the Peace, or any Judge of any County Court, except as hereinafter provided, or when acting as Stipendiary Magistrate for the Town of Summerside, shall exercise within the said Town any powers, authority or jurisdictions which now are or hereafter may be vested in the Stipendiary Magistrate of the said Town."

Mr. McArthur moved that this latter section be struck out, but the motion was lost, and the bill was reported agreed to without amendment.

On motion of Mr. J. Augustine McDonald the bill to incorporate "Fisheries Fisheries, Ltd.," was read a third time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Saunders the bill to amend the Act incorporating the Diocesan Church Society of P. E. Island was read a third time and passed.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Stewart, the bill entitled an Act to amend "The Statute Law" was read a second time and committed, Mr. Buntain in the chair. This bill provides a perpetual close season for pheasants in order that they may be propagated here, and that, part
