**HOW TO COOK A TENDER HAM IN WATER**

Place whole ham or piece of ham in a large kettle with water to cover. Bring to a boil; then turn heat low, and simmer (do not boil) for same period as indicated in baking timetable.

These hams, which have been boned and rolled, must be cooked before eating. National brands can serve them sliced cold. You can simmer or bake. We found about 23 min. per lb. at 325 deg. F. about right for baking such hams after they had been refrigerated. If you use a meat thermometer, heat the ham to 150 to 155 deg. F. on the thermometer.

National brands of cooked smoked hams have been cooked completely by the meat packer. You can heat them, following directions on the wrapper. We found we needed about 14 min. per lb. at 325 deg. F. to heat the meat for serving. If you use a meat thermometer, heat the meat to 130 deg. F. on the thermometer.) Then cover ham with a glaze and return it to a 400 deg. F. oven for 15 min., or until brown.

**In Memoriam**

**J. J. DUFFY**

The death of J. J. Duffy, Hawthorne Avenue, Charlottetown, on Thursday, October 9th, came as a great shock to all. The deceased had been in his usual good health until several days before his demise when he suffered a heart attack while working in his garden. However he recovered from this and was about as usual until Thursday when a second attack proved fatal.

The deceased was born in Fort Augustus, P.E.I. on November 19th, 1878 — the son of the late James F. and Mrs. Duffy — the latter being formerly Catherine Hughes. He received his early education at the rural school and later attended at the Dry Goods firm of S. A. MacDonald in this city for eleven years was an efficient employee of this thriving concern being in charge of the Men's Ready-to-wear Department when he resigned to accept a position in the Charlottetown Post Office. Here he became familiar and efficient in all branches of postal work being clerk-in-charge of the Money Order Department at the time of his Superannuation. During the few short years he had been spared to enjoy his well earned retirement, he had not been idle but had been busily engaged beautifying his magnificent residence at Hawthorne Avenue which stands today as a tangible example to all of what can be accomplished in the making of a beautiful home. Truly it can be said of the late Mr. Duffy that he was an honest man, a genial companion, a faithful worker and a true friend. Many indeed miss his genial smile and his warm hand clasp.

He was a strong supporter of the Conservative party and always took a deep interest in the affairs of his country. Few people had a wider general knowledge than he and it was truly a pleasure to converse with him. He took an active part in the promotion of any project for the welfare of the country and was also a member of the Benevolent Irish Society and the Knights of Columbus.

The late Mr. Duffy was a devoted Roman Catholic and his place was seldom vacant at Mass in the Basilica. He was moreover a conscientious worker in religious activities and will be sorely missed by his fellow laymen.

He leaves to mourn a sorrowing wife and two sisters, Sister Estelle of Lebanon, N. H., U.S.A., and Mrs. Sheehan of this city.

The tangible tributes to his memory consisting of floral wreaths, Mass Cards, Spiritual Bouquets, letters and cards of sympathy were many and varied attesting to the high esteem in which the deceased was held by his many friends.

His funeral took place on Monday, October 13th, from his late residence Hawthorne Avenue, to Saint Dunstan's Basilica where Solemn High Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the pastor, Rev. P. F. McDonald, assisted by Rev. P. J. McDonald as deacon and Rev. David McTague as subdeacon. Present in the Sanctuary were His Excellency Bishop Boyle, Msgr. Maurice McDonald, Rev. Ronald McDonald, P.E.I., East Point and Rev. Louis Callaghan, P.P., Fort Augustus. The hearse was preceded to the Basilica by members of the Benevolent Irish Society and by members of the Knights of Columbus. The honorary pallbearers were: Dr. W.J.P. MacMillan, W. Chester S. McLaure, M. P. Roy Cudmore, D. A. MacKinnon, Capt. J. J. Connolly and Patrick Murnaghan. The active pallbearers were Joseph Paquet, George Beers, Furness Matheson, Urtas MacDonald, John Cronin and P. S. Bradley. Interment took place in the Catholic cemetery where services were conducted by Dr. McMahon. The funeral was very largely attended by residents of Charlottetown and vicinity.

To the sorrowing wife and sisters the Guardian extends sincere sympathy. May he rest in peace.

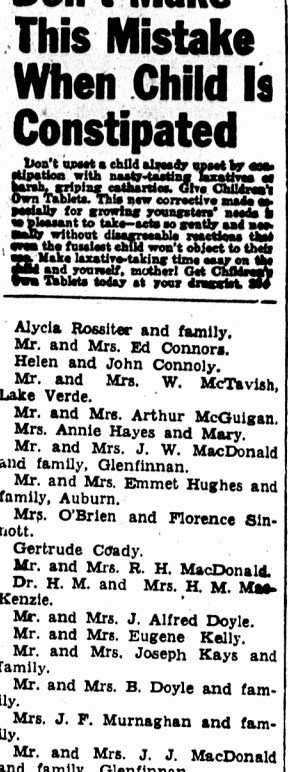

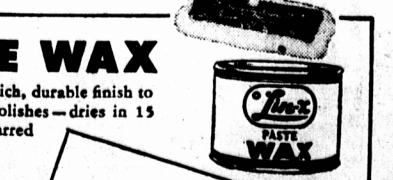
