**The Markets**

**TORONTO, March 31.**—The demand for eggs here continues good with buying prices unchanged. Sales are being made to retailers at extras 34-35; firsts 32-33; seconds 30. Jobbing prices are 1c lower.

**MONTREAL.**—The demand for eggs here is slow today with dealers waiting for the reaction from the removal of the dumping duty. Prices in a jobbing way have held at extras 34; firsts 32; seconds 29. Indications from the West are that no change is expected. Eggs are offered from Moose Jaw at extras 32; firsts 30; seconds 20. The Edmonton asking prices are the same except for seconds which are offered at 25c.

**VANCOUVER.**—There is no change in prices on this market, with dealers continuing to buy from producers at extras 23-25; firsts 20-23; pullet extras 18-21.

**HALIFAX.**—The egg market here is quiet and unchanged. There have been no exports this week and receipts are increasing rapidly. Some fresh fowl are offered and also some frozen chickens and fowl.
