RAILWAY PASSES FOR EMPLOYEES

MONTREAL, Aug. 14.—The minister of railways has issued a circular to I. J. R. employees on the pass question. The minister's reply to the delegation which recently waited on him is to the following effect:

"Passes may be issued to employees when sent out by superiors on railway business; when given leave of absence to consult with officers of the road, to attend meeting of employees; each employee, who has completed one full year's service, may be given one pass per year. A limited number of additional passes may be given to each employe in case of serious illness or death in the family or of other unusual circumstances. Each of these cases must be submitted to the general manager with a statement of facts. In case of an employe in the train service the district superintendent may issue a pass to return home. Each employe who has completed one year's full service may be given one pass each year for his wife and family residing with and depending upon him for support." The circular, in effect, makes a slight concession from the order recently issued by the minister.

SOMETHING OF LORD HADDO'S WIFE

OTTAWA, Aug. 17.—Lord Haddo, eldest son of the Earl of Aberdeen, lord lieutenant of Ireland, and former governor of Canada, a widower, at St. Columbus church, London, last Monday, in the presence of a large and fashionable congregation, Lord Haddo, who is heir to one of the greatest of Scottish earldoms and still in the twenties, is following a new fashion, and marrying a lady some years older than himself. Mrs. Cockayne is well known in Manchester, where her husband was a leading merchant. She resided to London. It was while attending college that Lord Haddo met Mrs. Cockayne, whose eldest son, three years his junior, was a school mate. Lord Haddo is descended from that great master of English prose, John Bunyan, and as such ancestry betokens, she is, as keenly interested in philanthropic and social problems as is the Countess of Aberdeen herself. Lord Haddo, who is his father's aide-camp at Dublin Castle, prefers a country life, and some time ago Lord Aberdeen presented him with a charming Scottish estate not far from Haddo House.
