**Built Warships With 18-in. Guns**

(Canadian Press Despatch.)  
WASHINGTON, Oct. 2.—Battleships equipped with 18-inch guns, three inches bigger than any now afloat, and two inches greater than the largest guns projected for the new battleships and battle-cruisers to be added to the American navy, are under construction in Great Britain, according to unofficial advices which are given credence by naval officials here.

The big weapons are designed primarily, officials believe, for use against land fortifications. As a means of developing floating forts which could throw great projectiles over the horizon, the reported British venture in battleship construction is regarded by ordnance experts here as having great possibilities. They estimate that shells weighing nearly 3,000 pounds could be used effectively, and point out that an eighteen-inch gun would have a range equal to if not greater than the average European coast defence ordnance.
