Hockey At Bedeque

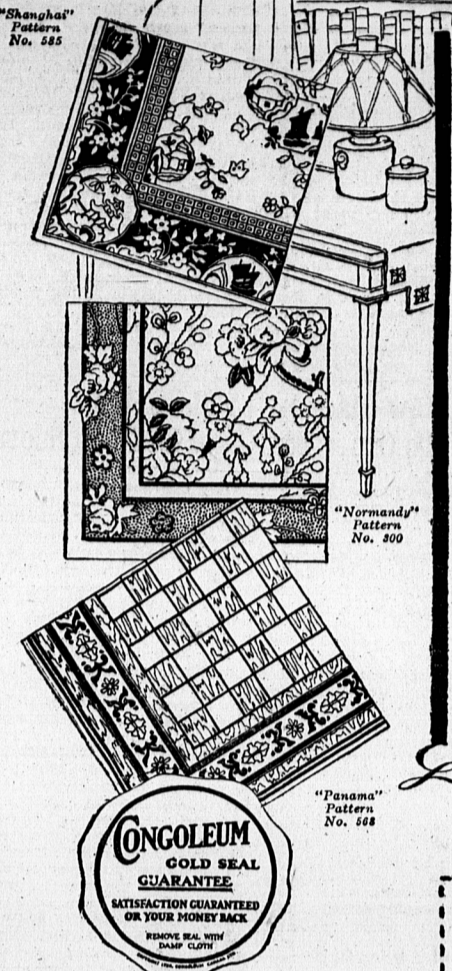
