725 BODIES RECOVERED.

NEW YORK, June 20.—The death list of those who perished in the General Slocum disaster is growing at an alarming rate. Bodies came to the surface today off the shores of North Brother Island singly and in groups of twos and threes, until at dusk 93 additional had been recovered. Every passing steamer seemed to churn the water to such a degree that with its wash one or two more bodies would be swept into the beach. This brings the total number of bodies recovered up to 725 and yet there are something like 300 persons unaccounted for.

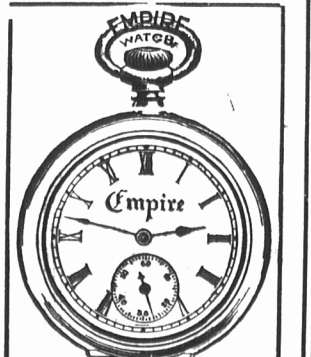
