Crop Prospects Varied in N. S.

HALIFAX, June 22—(CP)—Dry weather during the last week has greatly improved crop prospects in Cape Breton, but reports from Amherst, N.S., indicate that less than 35 per cent of crops in Cumberland County have been planted.

Hector F. MacIntyre, Nova Scotia agricultural representative said at Sydney today that Cape Breton farmers could expect a sharp improvement over last year's crops when exceptional rain and extreme heat turned most into failures.

May crop prospects in Cape Breton are reported to be "excellent" and far ahead of last year. May production in 1947 was an average yield, but there were no late rains because of hot, dry weather.

Farmers are gloomy in the Cumberland area, fearful that the late planting of grains will not allow adequate time for ripening. The only bright spot is the heavy crop of hay that has come through the rainy spell in good condition.

Farmers predict an "above average" strawberry crop in the Cumberland district.

Planting in Southampton and Wentworth Valleys and in the Parrsboro area has been more general than in other parts of the Province.
