MONTREAL, Aug. 15 (CP)—What some people have termed "undue summer exposure of female shoulders on the streets" received the attention of Councillor Dave Rochon today and forthwith he came up with a suggestion for soothing the feelings of sunsuit wearers and those whom the bare shoulders offend.

He would have policemen patrolling Montreal's central districts carrying thin, pretty printed paper boleros in their pocket. They would offer one to any woman walking the avenues with too much "bare" on her shoulder.

Mr. Rochon said he intends to bring his suggestion before City Council if and when the city executive committee proposes by-law on the subject comes up formally.

Body In Cellar Reveals New Murder In Ontario

ST. CATHARINES, Ont., Aug. 15 (CP)—The body of John Samborski, 54, was found today cemented into a shallow grave in the basement of his home here.

Neighbors called police to the home when they became suspicious of a great number of flies swarming about a basement window. They told police that through this window and out of the cellar a large quantity of earth had been shoveled.

Police said they are seeking a son of the dead man, who is believed to have left the St. Catharines district about mid-July.

Samborski operated a shoe repair shop at the front of the home. Following his disappearance about July 16, a sign appeared in the shop window that the store would be closed until the end of August.

Today's discovery makes the eighth slaying in Southern Ontario in slightly over two weeks.

A police guard was stationed around the building which housed Samborski's shoe shop and his son's medicine store.

A native of Russia, Samborski came to St. Catharines about 14 months ago and is believed to have lived in Timmins, Ont. previously. His son moved here from Hamilton shortly before Samborski came here. His former wife is believed to be in the Simcoe district.

Election Is Setback For Communists

FRANKFURT, Germany, Aug. 15 (AP)—A scholarly politician and an author were in line today to head the West German republic as a result of the Sunday election victory of anti-socialist parties.

Tall, Jean Konrad Adenauer, 73-year-old chairman of the Conservative Christian Democrats, is considered the natural choice for chancellor, a position equivalent to prime minister.

Theodor Heuss, 65, author of more than 20 books, whose father took part in the abortive German revolution of 1918, was widely mentioned for president, a job with a bigger title but less power. He is head of the right-wing Free Democrats.

Christian Democrats and Free Democrats moved quickly toward a coalition to govern 47,000,000 Germans following a complete count of the Sunday vote in which 492 deputies were chosen for West Germany's first Parliament.

The election proved a decisive setback for the Communists who gathered but 3.74 per cent of the vote, and two extreme nationalist parties — the German Party and the German Right Party, who together got only 5.83 per cent.

Although the Social Democrats, who favored a program similar to the British Labor Party, ran second with 20.4 per cent, they had no socialist allies to whom they could turn to organize a coalition.

Together, the Christian Democrats and Free Democrats held only 11 seats of having a majority. It appeared they could easily pick these up by linking with one of the small right-wing parties also opposed to socialism.

Six Bombs Dropped On Ontario Farm

HAVELOCK, Ont., Aug. 15—Six bombs were dropped today on the farm of Roy Outwater, three miles east of here, by an unidentified plane.

Havelock is about 20 miles northeast of Peterborough.

The bombs exploded 100 feet from a barn, left craters two feet deep and started a grass fire which was extinguished by Mr. and Mrs. Outwater and neighbors.

Reason for the bombing is unknown. There is no recognized bombing range in the area.

R.C.A. officials at Trenton tonight declined comment, except to say the matter was under investigation.

Nfld. Premier Guest Speaker At Ceremony

The spirit of festivity was abroad last evening at the Exhibition Grounds when Hon. Joseph Smallwood, Premier of Newfoundland formally declared open Prince Edward Island's celebrated Old Home Week before thousands of holiday makers from near and far.

Dr. J.P. Lantz, vice-president of the Provincial Exhibition Association presided and introduced Lt. Governor J.A. Bernard who welcomed one and all to this week's high spot in Island hospitality.

In introducing the principal speaker, Premier J. Walter Jones spoke of the Island ancestry of "this atom of a man, popularly known at home as 'Joey'" and welcomed Mr. Smallwood to the Island.

In a jocular vein, Premier Smallwood told of sitting in at yesterday's cabinet meeting and "hearing little but talk of the form of the various horses which will be racing during the week."

He stated he was being advised in this matter by Premier Jones and had taken the precaution to bring an extra shirt with him so that he might return home properly dressed.

Premier Smallwood stated that Newfoundland hoped to put on an Old Home Week itself in the near future and that he was keeping "hearing little but talk of the secrets of the R.H.'s success."

Rapid Red Advance On Canton Reported

CANTON, China, Aug. 15 (AP)—Reliable private reports tonight said the Communists had captured Nanking, 195 miles northwest of Canton, and were striking rapidly southward.

Chinese Nationalist military spokesmen acknowledged that the Reds had by-passed Kanhsien, stubborn Nationalist resistance point 215 miles from Canton, and had attacked Nanking. The loss of Nanking was not yet admitted officially, however.

Flood of Letters

During July's heat wave executive chairman J.O. Asselin said a flood of letters had reached civic officials complaining about the wearing of shorts, low-cut sun dresses and dresses which bare the midriff. Tension Grows Along Greek, Albanian Border

ATHENS, Aug. 15 (CP)—Tension grew along the Greek-Albanian border tonight as the Greek army claimed it had wiped out organized Communist guerrilla resistance in the Vitsi mountain redoubt.

The Greek general staff announced that the bodies of 20 Albanian soldiers had been picked up two miles inside Greek territory near Kroustolopi on the west side of the demolished redoubt. Along with the bodies, the staff said, was recovered the record of an Albanian army company which gave "precious information of Albanian aid to the guerrillas."

U. S. Arms Plan Approved By House Committee

WASHINGTON, Aug. 15 (AP)—President Truman's \$1,160,000,000 program to arm North Atlantic Pact countries against any Soviet aggression was approved in full today by the House of Representatives in a 378-10 vote.

The committee tied a string to the program to make sure that the non-Communist Western European countries set up mutual defense plans satisfactory to the United States.

The committee voted to make half the \$1,160,000,000 available in cash, and give the President authority to enter into contracts covering the rest.

But the members, by a reported vote of 10 to 9, decided that use of both cash and contract authority shall end next March 31 unless the President certifies to Congress that the United States has approved of mutual-defense plans worked out by the defence command of the Atlantic pact countries.

The committee, whipping the bill into shape for possible House consideration this week, turned down an attempt by Representative J. Cabot Lodge (Rep., Conn.) to make \$200,000,000 available for non-Communist China.

However, it expressed hope unanimously that non-Communist countries of the Far East will work out a pact with United States cooperation, for mutual development and defence.

In the Senate, Senators Arthur Vandenberg (Rep., Mich.) and John Foster Dulles (Rep., N.Y.) formally proposed broad restrictions on the arms program, saying such curbs wouldn't delay the program at all.

They sought to slash \$100,000,000 off funds for the pact countries and split \$1,000,000,000 which would leave half cash and half contract authority.

New Constitution For Syria Planned

DAMASCUS, Aug. 15 (Reuters)—The new Syrian cabinet, formed Sunday after a military coup d'etat, tonight announced it would "prepare a new constitution, follow the government which renounced the regime of Marshal-President Husni Zayim. Zayim was executed in a military coup along with his Premier Sunday morning.

The cabinet's policy was announced by Premier Hashem Atassi this morning.

Col. Hannawi handed him the power he seized Sunday following the military trial and execution of Husni Zayim and Premier Muzhrib Barazi.

Atassi said tonight: "We are a provisional government. Our main task is to pave the way for the early election of a constituent assembly to prepare a new constitution in full freedom."

Col. Hannawi said he will return to army life, now that his "sacred national mission" is ended.

AMMAN, Hashemite Jordan, Aug. 15 (AP)—The whole Arab world except Egypt today expressed satisfaction with the new Syrian Government headed by the military leader of Marshal-President Husni Zayim. Zayim was executed in a military coup along with his Premier Sunday morning.

Syria's neighbors hung back more than a day wondering whether one military dictator would be merely replaced by another.

Broadcast and dispatches from the Arab capitals tonight indicated the swift turnover to a civilian cabinet headed by former President Hashem Atassi reassured the Arab states.

Youths Get Year For Theft Of Automobile

MONTREAL, Aug. 15 (CP)—Three youths from South Bathurst, N.B., who pleaded guilty today before Judge C.E. Guerin to stealing a 1930 automobile last Thursday, told the judge they did it because they had no other way to get from Montreal to Toronto.

They were John Hachey, 20, Ernest Christie, 19, and Edgar Dugan, 22.

"So you stole a car to get from Quebec to Ontario?" asked the judge.

One of the accused said they had.

"Well," replied the judge, "I am afraid you'll have to stay in this Province for another year. And don't do it again or you might find yourselves staying for yet another year or maybe two. One year in jail for each."

Fail To Set New Deep Dive Record

SMUGGLER'S COVE, Calif., Aug. 15 (AP)—A family generator today thwarted marine explorer Otis Barton on his attempt to drop deeper into the ocean depths than man has ever gone before.

It was but one more of the mechanical troubles that have plagued him for three days in his effort to reach 6,000 feet.

He did, however, descend to 2,300 feet. Barton and Dr. William Beebe of the New York Zoological Society set the existing deep dive record of 3,028 feet off Bermuda in 1934.

Originally scheduled for Saturday, Barton was unable to even attempt the descent until today.

The steel sphere he is using, called a bathysphere, was dropped 5,800 feet, again empty Sunday.

57 Forest Fires Burning In Ontario

TORONTO, Aug. 15 (CP)—Fifty-seven fires are burning in Ontario bushland, under-dry after days of late-summer heat. All the fires are under control, but forestry crews are anxiously watching changes which could affect the fire situation.

HEAVY TYPHOON TOLL
SHANGHAI, Aug. 15 (AP)—Belated reports, mostly from Roman Catholic missions, indicated today close to 15,000 persons within a 60-mile radius of Shanghai lost their lives in the July 25 typhoon. The Nanhai section, 30 miles southeast of Shanghai, reported several thousand were drowned and 180,000 were made homeless.

Expect T. L. C. To Expel C.S.U.

TORONTO, Aug. 15 (CP)—The Communist-run Canadian Seaman's Union will be kicked out of the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada next month, according to indications shaping up today within the T.L.C.

The C.S.U., a storm centre of a ship strike that has had repercussions in ports around the globe, has been under suspension from the 400,000-member Congress since June 3 following a year-long internal feud in the T.L.C. over Communism.

It was learned here that the Congress executive will recommend to the T.L.C. annual convention opening at Calgary Sept. 15 that the C.S.U. be ejected altogether.

More Credit Used In Car Purchases

OTTAWA, Aug. 15 (CP)—The average Canadian buying credit this year is using the credit plan more than he did a year ago. A total of 110,085 vehicles were financed to the extent of \$104,540,000 in the six months as compared with 76,034 financed for an amount of \$70,515,000 in the corresponding 1948 period.

Other Pilots Assist

Post-war Squatters Face Eviction In Ottawa

OTTAWA, Aug. 15 (CP)—After three years, the Government has given eviction notices to the pioneers in Canada's most prolonged uprising of homeless veterans.

The Justice Department, through a lawyer, has told the 34 families living in two great old homes on Sandy Hill they must get out by the end of the month. The Defence Department needs the space, they say.

The families, many of them people who were in on the original seizure in September 1946 or who moved in shortly after, said today they're going to fight, back. One tenant spokesman said they'll appeal right to Prime Minister St. Laurent.
