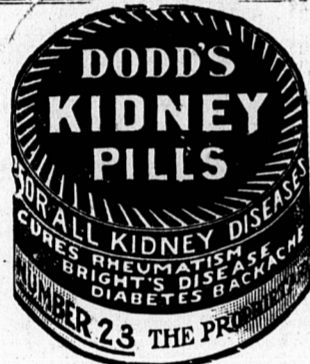

SERMONS PREACHED AT ALEXANDRA CHURCH

MORNING SERMON.

ALEXANDRIA, Aug. 12.--At the recent reopening of the United Baptist Church, which had been undergoing repairs, Rev. Mr. Field of Tryon preached in the morning and in the evening. Rev Geo Orman of the Methodist church gave a stirring address in the afternoon. J. D. Seaman, Charlottetown assisted with the services.

The following is an extract of Mr Field's sermon: Acts 2, 4.--The speaker showed that among the ancient predictions of the gospel times and gospel blessings the prophecy of Joel was none the least. "It shall come to pass in the last days" saith the Lord, "I shall pour out my spirit upon all flesh." St. Peter under the immediate influences of the spirit assures us that the promise was fulfilled on the day of Pentecost. "This is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel etc. The day of Pentecost was a day observed by the Jews in memory of giving the law at Sinai about fifteen hundred years before. On this day they presented the first fruits of the harvest to God. How highly was this day honored. A new sanction was given to the observation of the first day of the week as the Christian Sabbath. The law of faith was first published from Mt. Zion. The first fruits of a glorious harvest of saved sinners were presented to God and thus our Lord who had been crucified at the passover feast fifty days before, was glorified at the feast of weeks. Upon both there was a vast assemblage of the people of Jerusalem. The day of Pentecost was fully come, suddenly there came upon the disciples a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind etc. This was not only to engage their attention but to serve as an emblem of the powerful influences on the minds of men, for by this operation the world was to be shaken. Christ made use of the emblem of wind or air in motion when he discoursed with Nicodemus. As the vital air is necessary to our existence in the body so the spirit of God is necessary to our spiritual existence. There was a striking emblem of the same kind in the parable of the dry bones Ezekiel 37. This parable or vision

fully represents not only the political state of the Jews and their recovery, but also the deplorable condition of men dead in trespasses and sins their renewal to spiritual life by the word and spirit of Christ. It shows there may be a lifeless form of godliness, but that the power of life is from the Holy Ghost etc. Another very remarkable sign accompanied the descent. "There appeared unto them very a suitable emblem of the gifts of tongues. Not the slow way of learning a foreign tongue. The dividing of tongues at Babel proved the unapproved means of losing the true knowledge of God. By this new division of tongues the knowledge of God was restored and readily communicated to men of every nation. These men were Galileans. This was the first miracle after the spirit was given, to enable his servants to preach it. They were tongues of fire. What was the subject which engaged the heaven taught tongues of the disciples. The wonderful works of God etc. The multitudes were amazed. The native Jews said: "These men are full of new wine. Then Peter full of the Holy Ghost lifted his voice and begged them not to have so much candor and not rashly to conclude them to be men overcome with liquor, especially by nine o'clock in the morning an hour in which it should seem no Jew was ever known to be drunk. But he directs their attention to a well known passage of scripture Acts 2, 13. Then he shows them God had sent down his spirit. The design of sermons was to convince of sin etc. Multitudes were pierced to the heart. We have taken a view of the glorious events which took place on the day of Pentecost. Now notice the stated work of the Holy Spirit. The extraordinary gifts of the spirit have long since ceased as Christianity is established and there is no longer occasion for them. But have the operations of the spirit ceased? We affirm that there is no true vital religion without them etc. He is promised to abide forever etc. He is promised as the common privilege of all believers etc.

EVENING SERMON.

Ecc 10. 1 The old proverb is concerned first of all not with dead bugs, or with perfumery and with drugs, but with a result a smell. And that smell is caused by the union of things which however good they may be in themselves, do not belong together. Just as a weed is a good plant in the wrong place the trouble all comes because of the unseemly mixture. The belief of the writer is that there should be a unity in every man's life, that there should be one thing above every other that he loves and for which he should be conspicuous. So Jesus said: "If the right hand cause you to stumble cut it off and cast it from you etc. Now the text teaches, (1) a little folly undoes the effect of much wisdom. Think of the politicians etc who in these days are being broken because of some unwise thing done years before. Therefore choose wisdom etc. (2) A little badness undoes the effect of much goodness. The world makes one sin cover a multitude of good. It does so in reality also. The one evil in your life preemates the whole life etc. You have witnessed the attempt to cover up a foul odor by means of perfumery or disinfectants and it may have killed it for a moment but then penetrating and noisome it manifested itself again. So shall it ever be. A little badness undoes much goodness. Is your life a unity? Is it dominated by some strong principle? If so, what is that principle? You say you will not settle it, then know this, it will settle you.

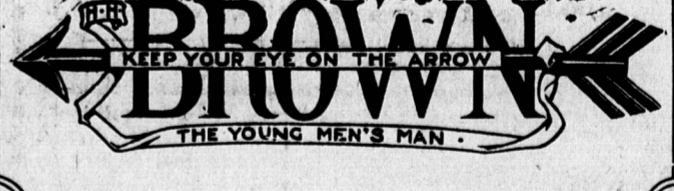
