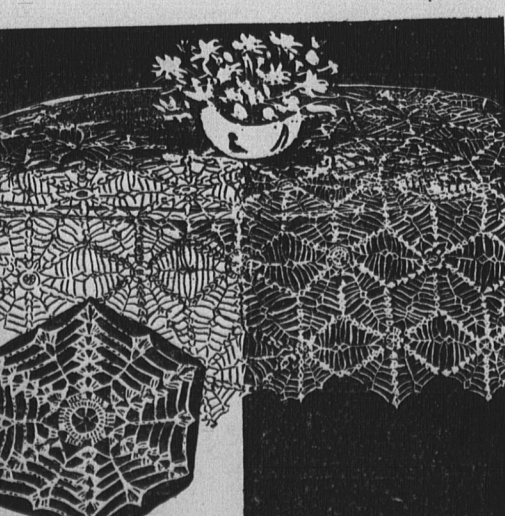

THE COOK'S CORNER

CHOCOLATE SYRUP

1-2 cup cocoa or grated chocolate
1 cup cold water
1-2 cups sugar
Dash of salt
2 teaspoons vanilla
Method: Combine cocoa or grated chocolate and cold water in a pan and stir direct heat until the mixture is smooth. Now add the sugar and a dash of salt and stir until the sugar is completely dissolved. Boil for 5 minutes, add the vanilla and pour the mixture into a glass jar. Seal and store in the refrigerator or a cool place until you wish to use it.
This may be used for iced cocoa by mixing it with rich milk, or as a flavoring for ice cream, custards, pudding sauce, or whipped cream.

CHOCOLATE MILK SHAKE

4 tablespoons chocolate syrup
1 glass milk
Crushed ice
Method: Combine the syrup, milk and a little crushed ice in a sealer. Seal it tightly and then shake the mixture thoroughly. Serve in a tall glass. To prepare a chocolate float, add 3 tablespoons chocolate ice cream to the above chocolate milk shake.

COCOA EGG NOG

1 egg white
1 teaspoon sugar
1 teaspoon cocoa
Dash of salt
3-4 cup cold milk
Method: Beat the egg white until stiff and gradually beat in the sugar and the cocoa. Add a dash of salt. Divide the mixture in half and add the milk to one half, beating constantly. Turn this into a tall glass and pile the remaining egg mixture on top.

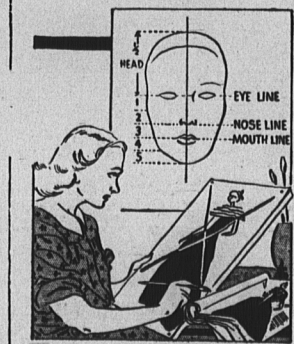
FROSTED MINT CHOCOLATE

2 squares unsweetened chocolate
1 cup water
1-2 cup sugar
1-4 teaspoon salt
1 quart milk
1 teaspoon vanilla
1-2 teaspoon peppermint extract
1 cup ice cream
Method: Place the chocolate with the water in the top of a double boiler. Heat until the chocolate is melted, then stir and cook over low direct heat until slightly thickened. Add the sugar and milk and cook for 5 minutes. Chill, then add flavorings, salt and ice cream and beat with a rotary beater until well blended. Serve in tall glasses with or without the addition of another tablespoon of ice cream.

APRICOT EGG NOG

2 eggs, separated
1-2 cups milk
Dash of salt
1 No. 2 can apricot halves
1-4 cup whipped cream
Method: Separate the eggs and beat the yolks until thick and lemon colored. Then stir in the milk gradually, then add the salt. Put the apricots through a sieve and reserve 1-4 cup of the pulp. Add the remaining apricot pulp and juice to the egg-milk mixture. Fold in the egg whites that have been stiffly beaten and pour into tall glasses. Whip the cream until stiff and fold in the 1-4 cup apricot pulp. Garnish the egg nogs with this.

Once you have these main proportions, the finishing touches come easier—shaping the eye and mouth, drawing the soft contours of the hair.

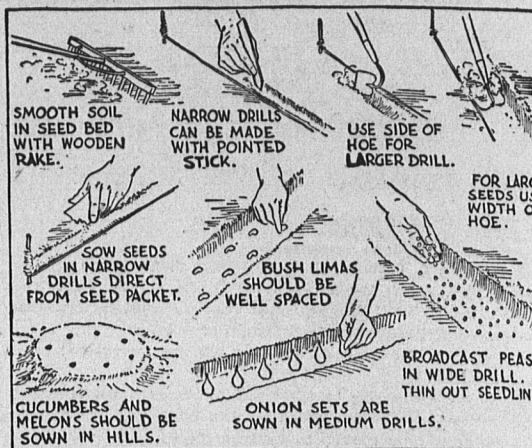

Simple Garden Technique Gives Professional Finish



Technique of Seed Sowing in Garden Rows

Skilled gardeners do not make plants grow. They let them grow. Experience soon teaches that fussing and pampering is more likely to harm than help. The real task of the gardener is to provide a favorable environment for the plant, as to soil, sunshine and moisture, and then devote himself to removing any obstacle to thrifty growth that may develop. Nature will do the rest.

In the Defense Garden the program of care may be reduced to five rules which, if accepted, and I've used up to, will advance any amateur to a degree of skill which few amateurs attain. They are:

1. Plant in straight rows, running north and south.
2. Do not plant more space than you can cultivate well.
3. Thin out mercilessly plants that are too thickly sown.
4. Feed plants with a complete balanced plant food.
5. Spray to prevent disease and kill insects.

These things may seem so simple as to amount to little; but only good gardeners observe them. When the gardening fever is on—especially to stretch a line and see that seeds are planted exactly upon it, each row parallel to the next. But when plants have grown and we come to push a wheel hoe between the rows, then we realize that five minutes spent in aligning the seeds would have saved weary hours in following the zigzag lines with the cultivator, to say nothing of the unsightly appearance of a slovenly planted garden as compared to the just pride we take in straight rows of well-developed vegetables cleanly cultivated.
