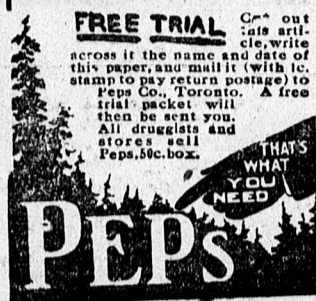

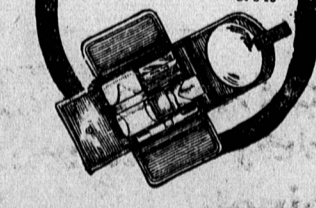

I.; William at present home on military leave; Harry and Samuel, Sadie and Cora, Nettie and Lexie all home at present. The sympathy of the whole community goes out to Mr. Davison and family in the trials and sickness that they are called upon to bear during the last few months.
