JAIL DELIVERY AT TOLEDO

Five United States Prisoners Escaped by Means of a Chimney.

Toledo, O., May 10.—One of the most daring jail deliveries in the history of Toledo occurred about 4 o'clock this morning, and as a result five United States prisoners—Thomas Burns, William Miller, George Jones, and William White, the Leipsic postoffice robbers, and Fred Williams—are at large. A sixth man, William Cox, was captured while trying to follow the others.

The prisoners climbed up the brick chimney at the rear end of the county jail. Cox was discovered as he reached the top by a young colored lad George Hightower. With a revolver the lad held Cox at the top of the chimney while he shouted for help.

As soon as those about the jail saw the boy making frantic gestures they telephoned the police department and several officers soon reached the jail. A second message was sent to Engine House No. 3 for a hook and ladder truck to get the prisoner down, as the last man down had evidently broken the rope.

Cox was covered with soot and a deplorable looking object. He said that during the night one of the prisoners secured a key, went to the various cells and took out the smaller of the men. The smallest man went up the chimney first. He carried with him a rope made of sheets and a bar which had been wrenched from the bottom of the chimney. The others helped him up. With the iron bar he knocked off the bars at the top of the chimney. He then went up on the roof and was quickly followed by the others.

PRODUCE MARKETS.

MONTREAL, MAY 10th.—There is not much going on in the cheese situation just now, advices from the other side being a little less favorable.

INGERSOLL, Ont., May 8.—The season has been decidedly backward for early cheese in this section, and, aside from the marketing of a few hundred boxes for local consumption around 10c per pound, very little has been done. Recently exporters have been taking a few boxes at 9c, but now they show an inclination to cut even this figure. The prospects at present are not very encouraging for the May make, as farmers generally complain about the effect of the lack of rain. Should there be a good rainfall, however, followed by some warmer evenings, the conditions would be altered.

Finest creamery is steady at 16c to 16 1/2c in boxes. Eastern Townships dairy is quoted at 14c to 15c, and western 12c to 13c.

Owing to the liberal receipts of the past few days, the tone of the egg market was easier to-day, but prices show little change. The demand was good and trade is active at 11c for choice, and at 9 1/2 to 10c for No. 2 per dozen. Receipts today were 1,218 cases.

There continues to be a good demand for maple product and the market is fairly active and firm. We quote: Syrup, in wood, \$ 3c to 6c per lb; and at 65c to 70c per tin. Sugar sold at 7 1/2c to 8c per lb.
