No Exact Figures Of French Damage

Paris, Dec. 14.—The French delegates to the conference are going there without any exact figures as to the damages France suffered by reason of the war according to the newspapers. Various estimates are given, but they are not definite. The Brussels conference will be only the preliminary stage and will serve a useful purpose, even if definite propositions are not evolved.

Estimates made by the various French ministries of France's damages are said to total 230,000,000,000 francs but Louis Dubois, president of the reparations commission

referred to be dissatisfied with the form in which the documents were prepared and has refused to present them to the reparations commission. Therefore, it is asserted a new set of figures is being prepared in accordance with the ideas of M. Dubois, but they will not be ready for two weeks.

Some of the newspapers contrast the high rank of the other representatives at Brussels with the official positions of the French delegates, M. Cheysson and M. Seydoux but all of them agree that as the Brussels conference will be a technical meeting, it is adequate to send technical experts. The French delegates are commented on as being able men, particularly M. Seydoux who is declared to be endowed with a remarkable brain.

French Profiteer Realized Fortune

Paris, December 14.—The life history of a French war profiteer was told this afternoon in the Chamber of Deputies by a former Minister who was interpellating the government on the failure to deal with this species. This man, said the deputy, was at the beginning of the war an employee of a coal mine company with a salary of 250 francs a month. With the war money he began at the outset of the war to speculate on coal prices and by the time the war was finished he had realized a fortune which enabled him to keep four houses, three private automobiles and a racing stable.

When profiteer hunting began he was among those whom officers of justice began to inquire about. Profiteer with some of his assistants was arrested. By a curious coincidence his offices and all his books and accounts were the same day burned to the ground, and also the same day one of his race horses which he had bought in the "Eveson" won a race.

After a few days imprisonment the profiteer was set at liberty with a caution which was unnecessary as having made his fortune, he was retiring from business which was no longer profitable.

The deputy complained that legal action was taken only against small profiteers and the big ones escaped always with a caution. In reply M. L'Hopiteau, the Minister of Justice, said that over 14,000 speculators and profiteers had been haled into court and 11,000 cases punished with fines and imprisonment. Several deputies interrupted that all these punished were small shopkeepers and that the big men had escaped, but a vote of confidence that the government would continue the good work of hunting out the profiteers was carried.

The Markets

MONTREAL, Dec. 13.—There was no important change in the condition of the local market for eggs today, prices for all grades being firmly maintained under a continued good demand for supplies for home consumption and light receipts. The prospects are that a very active trade will be done during the holiday season. The receipts today were 75 cases, as compared with 56 cases for the same day last week, and 78 cases for the corresponding day a year ago.

Choice turkeys, per lb. 51c to 52c. Good turkeys 48c to 50c. Chickens 32c to 35c. Fowl 25c to 30c. Geese 29c to 31c. Ducks 30c to 40c.

The market for potatoes continues quiet and the undertone is easy. There is no further change in prices to note. The offerings of choice lots of Quebec stock are fairly liberal at \$1.60 to \$1.70 per bag of 90 lbs. extract. There was some demand for small lots for actual wants and sales were made at \$1.50 to \$1.90 per bag of 80 lbs., ex-store.
