



**FOOTBALL IN HALIFAX.**

The football players of Halifax are united in two leagues. The Senior league is made up of the Wanderer's first Team, the Dalhousie first team and the Fleet Team.

The Wanderer's second team, the Dalhousie Team, the Y. M. C. A. Team and the Crescents Team constitute the Junior League and each league has a trophy to be contested for by the several teams. 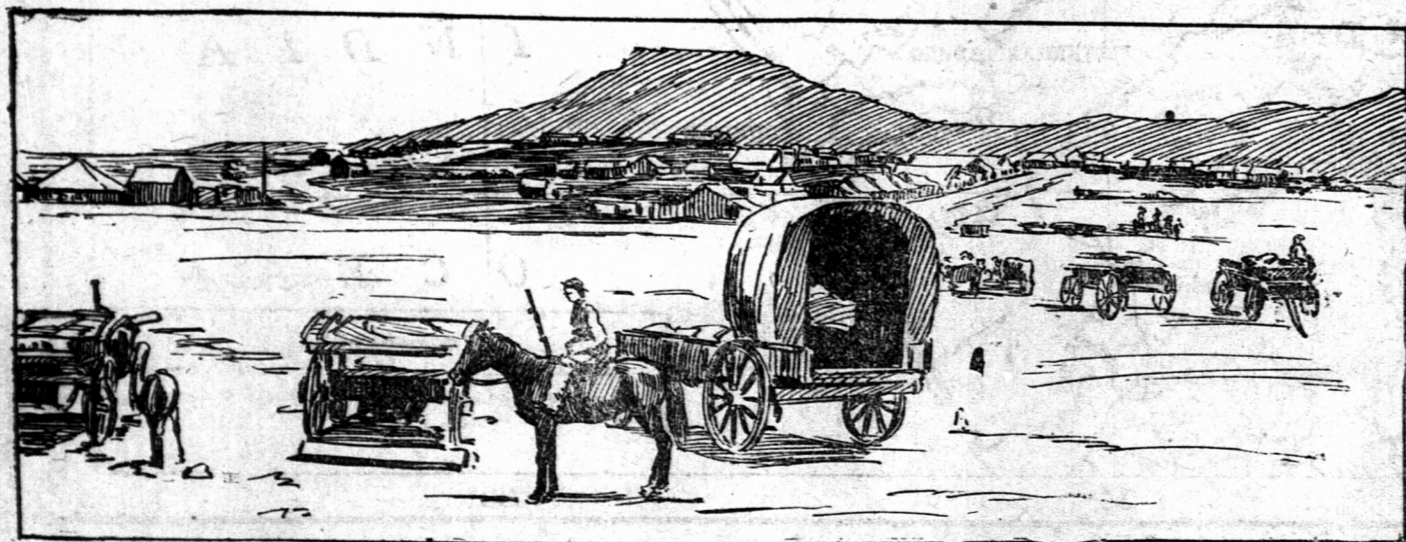

**THE WAR IN THE TRANSVAAL**

Ladysmith, Natal (population 2,669), the chief military station, 180 miles from Durban, 37 miles from the Orange Free State frontier at Von Reenan's Pass. There are four thousand infantry, and seven batteries, with 32 guns at Ladysmith.
