MIXING THINGS.

Among the serious drawbacks of the party system in politics is the tendency to discuss every question from a party standpoint, and to introduce party politics into every movement, moral, social or industrial. In no part of Canada is this tendency more general or more harmful than in Prince Edward Island. The enforcement of laws intended for the moral or material welfare of the community is hindered by partyism. Notably is this true in regard to the Canada Temperance Act and the Prohibitory Act in this city. The same is true with regard to public institutions, which are by no means so well conducted as if they were managed on a business basis and without partisanship. And the same thing is painfully true in regard to the measures necessary to protect the public health.

So strong are the bonds of party that men in opposition to the powers that be will frequently attack unjustly what is being done, exaggerate trifling errors of judgement and even pervert the facts while on the other side the friends of the party in power will blindly defend the action of their party leaders whether right or wrong, and will by their advocacy and their votes condone and defend actual and open wrong doing. This is an unhealthy condition of things. Men and women who read only one or other of the party journals receive a warped and misleading impression of things, are of course confirmed in their party predilections and unless they are singularly just, intelligent and fair-minded they come in the end to think that their own party is always in the right and whatever the other party may do is wrong.

It is especially desirable at a time like the present, when the public mind is in a somewhat excitable condition in regard to the public health, that all should, as far as that question is concerned, divest themselves of party feelings and prejudices and be in a position to advise and co-operate with, in a friendly spirit the several authorities who are entrusted with important duties. We cannot think that any Board of Health, Provincial Government or Federal Government would willingly endanger the health and lives of our citizens by anything they may do or neglect to do. It is clearly the duty of any who know a way to improve matters and contribute to the public security to advise the authorities to that end in a friendly way. Mere fault-finding especially from political motives, can do no good and may do much harm. It is a time for moderate, calm judgement, and for united counsel and effort for the security of the community. Politics will not be any the better, nor disease any the less dangerous if we mix small-pox and politics together. On the contrary such a mixing of things may do irreparable harm. There will be time enough to settle our political quarrels on their own proper basis when the present danger to the public health has passed away.
