LIQUOR HABIT

D. R. McNeill in Communication with

DR. A. M. ROSEBURGH

Of the Prisoners' Aid Society, Toronto. Treatment Conditional.

The subject of inebriety has long been under discussion, but until recently it has been treated as a failure in the fulfilment of one "jot" of the moral code, rather than as a disease curable by medical treatment. Still many homes of the people have remained haunts of vice and poverty caused by this terrible drink curse; the Prisons and Houses of Correction have remained crowded year in and year out by the victims of alcoholism. But happily, by the strenuous efforts of some in our community, who have brought the full light of medical science to bear upon this subject. The Prisoners Aid Society of Toronto has decided that it would be well worth an endeavor to give the imprisoned inebriates at least one chance to reform, this chance to be founded on reason, via correct medical treatment.
 Dr. R. McNeill has received a letter from Dr. A. M. Roseburgh, who is employed by the Prisoners' Aid Society of Toronto, in reply to a letter sent him some time ago. Dr. Roseburgh is prepared to treat inebriates in Charlottetown at a nominal cost. The treatment is based upon the following conditions:
 (a.) The case must be under the charge of a physician.
 (b.) He must be supplied with a full history of the case, the character of the inebriety, the habits of the patient whether he is really in earnest in his expressed desire for a cure.
 (c.) At least an approximate idea of the cause of the infirmity.
 In most cases all desire for alcoholics disappears in five days after commencing treatment.
