**Contract Bridge**

LEADING AGAINST A SLAM  
It is not usually good tactics to lead a trump against a slam contract—and particularly when the trump is an honor, the leader cannot be expected to lay it down.

In today's deal, however, West's failure to open his singleton ace of trumps gave the declarer an opportunity which he did not waste!

The bidding:  
South West North East  
3♥ Pass 6♥ Pass  
4♥ Pass

North admitted later that his jump to six hearts had been speculative, for all of his concentration of honor-tricks. An opening three-bid in one major suit usually implies shortness in the other major and therefore, even though North had only two spades, there was some reason to fear that South would be no longer in the suit and therefore would not be able to use North's hand in a ruffing sense.

However, all was well that ended well! West, not being second-sighted, made the natural lead of spades jack. South studied the dummy for a moment, then unerringly capitalized the one real chance to make the contract. He cashed the club ace and ruffed a club, then went back to dummy with a spade and ruffed the last club.

Only after the black suits had been stripped from the North-South hands did declarer lead a trump, and West's position, when he was thrown in with the black ace of trumps, can readily be seen. A spade of club return at this juncture would permit South to discard a diamond from either hand, and then the simple diamond finesse against the king would produce the contract. Actually, West led a diamond, and by ducking in dummy and winning with his own jack, South was able to run the diamond suit without loss.

It is obvious enough that if South had not stripped the spades and clubs before leading a trump, West would have had an easy and safe method of exiting.

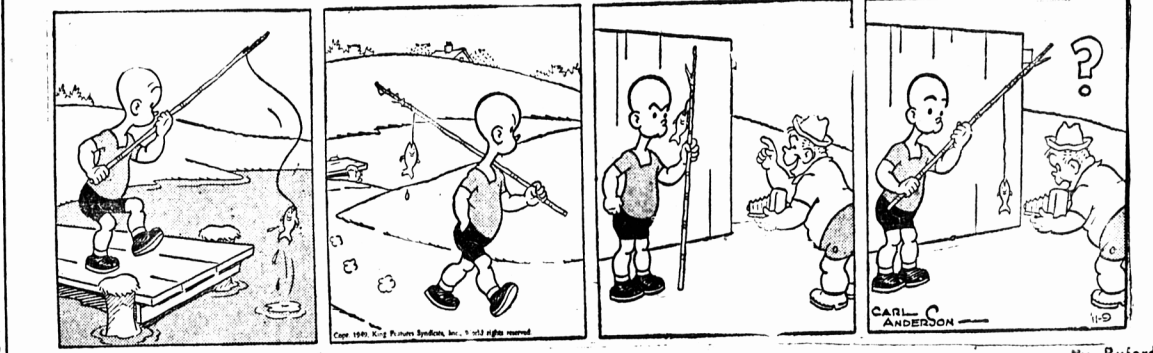

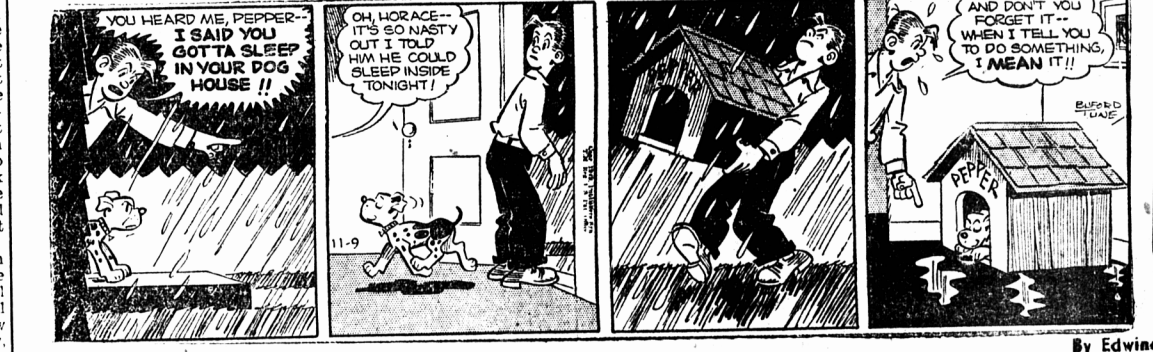

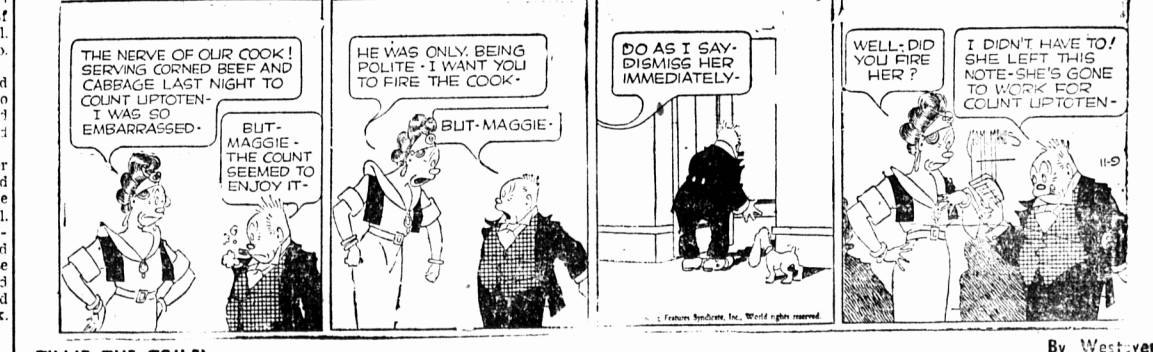
