THE International Steamship Line is fast becoming a popular route for those desiring to visit Boston. The short rail and water route should receive the attention of the traveller before purchasing a ticket by any other line. The Steamship "St. Croix" leaves St. John at 5.30 p. m. Tuesday and Saturday. Passengers from the Island may leave by the express at 9 in the forenoon, and reach Boston the next day about 1 p. m. The distance from Charlottetown to St. John is 216 miles and can be covered in 8 1/2 hours. The following description of the line will give an idea of the boats. The Dining Room is located on the Saloon Deck, thereby giving good ventilation. The tables when spread, will seat about one hundred passengers and are well supplied from the Eastern and New England markets. A large corps of waiters give prompt attention, and the tables of this Company are justly celebrated throughout the States and Provinces. The Steward's Department is under competent management, the Chief Stewards having been in the employ of the company many years, and careful attention is paid to the comfort of our patrons. Each steamer carries three Stewardesses, they giving particular attention to ladies and children. The staterooms are brilliantly lighted by electricity. The State Rooms open from the main saloon and dining saloon, or from alcoves, and are nicely fitted, and furnished with electric bells, and lighted by electricity. Prices are \$1.00 \$1.50 \$2.00 there are also a few bridal rooms, for which an extra charge is made.—The Main Saloon is located on the after part of the saloon deck, and is brilliantly lighted, and heated by steam. The top of the saloon is made with a dome, which gives good ventilation, and light by day.

A remarkable utterance on the Chinese situation is that of the Rev. Father Regis Canevin, rector of St. Paul's Cathedral, in the Pittsburg Chronicle Telegraph. Father Canevin says he is opposed to the advance of the allies on China, opposed to war with China, opposed to the sending of a single regiment to engage in combat with a heathen race. "Not only am I opposed to this advance on China, but I am ready to say with emphasis that I would rather see to-day the whole united company of missionary workers in China, both Catholic and Protestant, wiped out of existence than to know that a single regiment of soldiers of any nation had been slain. I speak from the standpoint of the ecclesiast. The missionaries are prepared for death. They are supposed to renounce the world, to be ready for the martyrdom, the persecution and the suffering. Death to them should mean the crown of immortality."—Toronto Globe.
