LONDON, Aug. 6 (Special).—The London Times say it has been ascertained that the accounts of the Women's Social and Political Union for the first months of 1913, when published, will be found to show over £21,000 received during that period towards the principal. The fund of the union is known as £250,000. The fund at the close of 1912 stood at £211,000. On June 30, 1913, the total was over £152,000. For the first quarter of the year the receipts varied from about £300 to £350 per week, but since April have been steadily rising. During July some £600 was collected at the Pavilion meetings; which the police have now stopped. The figures are in direct contradiction of the statement recently published in The London Daily Mail, to the effect that the militant funds were decreasing.
