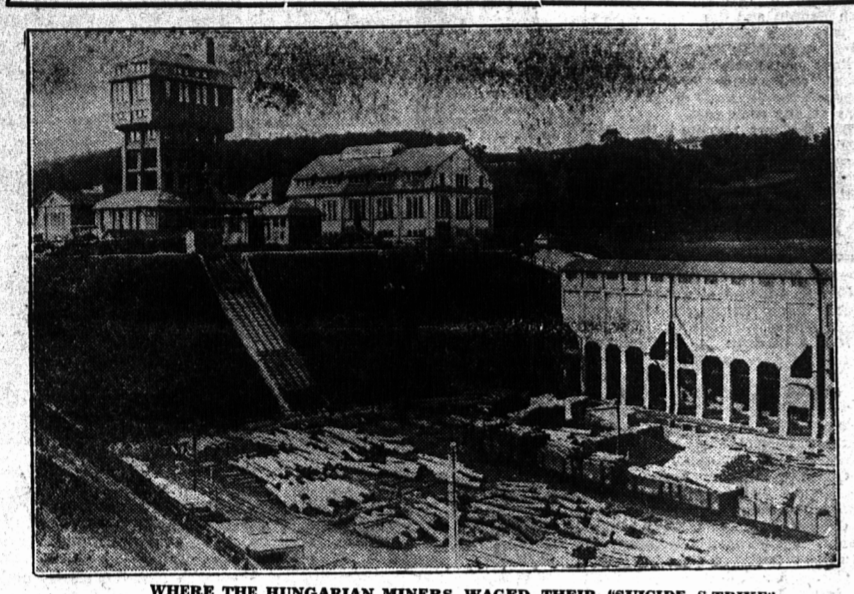

Urges Canadians Support Young People's Training

(C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, Oct. 22.—An appeal to Canadians to rally to the support of young people's training and recreational centres was made here tonight by A. O. Dawson, Montreal, President of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, coincident with the campaign of financial federations now in progress here, in Winnipeg and Vancouver. Other drives will take place in other cities of the Dominion within the next few weeks. "In the absence of a job and the opportunity limited to so few for higher education, community centres which depend upon the voluntary support of private citizens are the last line of defence between restless youth and demoralizing idleness," Mr. Dawson declared. "Thousands of boys and girls have graduated from our Canadian schools in the past five years, and probably two-thirds of them are still unemployed. They have gone out into a world which can apparently find no place for them, and mothers and fathers and welfare agencies are faced with the common problem of providing leadership and useful interest for these young people until they can be absorbed into the industrial and commercial life of our nations." In justice to them, he concluded, and with the future of Canada at heart, "let us redouble all efforts which will help our idle young people to grow into useful Canadian citizens."

MURDER TRIAL IS OPENED

By Guardian's Special Wire) QUEBEC, Oct. 22.—Only nine jurors were selected today in the Court of King's Bench to hear the case of Nelson Phillips, 19, on trial for the second time on a charge of murdering his young cousin, Maud Asch, at Gaspé, Phillips was convicted at his first trial and sentenced to be hanged by Chief Justice R. A. E. Greenfield, Montreal. He was successful in an appeal from the conviction and the sentence. About a year ago the torso of Maud Asch, 16, was found floating in the waters of Gaspé Bay, but the body of her cousin, Marguerite Asch, 16, who disappeared at the same time has not been recovered. The crime was allegedly committed in August, 1928. Accused's lawyers requested an English-speaking jury as they did at the first trial and when court adjourned only nine had been found suitable to both the Crown and the defence. The other three jurors will be chosen tomorrow with Dr. Rosario Fontaine, Montreal medic-legal expert, scheduled to be the first witness for the prosecution. A 1,000,000-candlepower ray, said to be capable of stunning all men and animals within its effective radius of one mile, is in a state of perfection in France. The present ray, it is explained, is produced from a sort of magazine pistol firing cartridge containing a secret powder. As the cartridges are exploded, impulses of the ray leave the pistol at regular intervals so brief as to permit no perceptible interruption. The museum house in City Road, London, E. C., in which John Wesley spent 12 years, from 1779 to 1791, has been reopened after the completion of an extensive scheme of renovation.

HAUPTMANN TO BE ARRAIGNED ON WEDNESDAY

(A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) TRENTON, N. J., Oct. 22.—Bruno Richard Hauptmann, one-time German machine gunner, will be called before the bar in the century-old Hunterdon County Court house at Flemington on Wednesday to enter formally his plea of "not guilty" to the indictment charging him with the murder of the infant son of Charles A. Lindbergh. The day of the arraignment, and the hour of 11 a. m. E. S. T., were fixed today at a conference attended by Supreme Court Justice Thomas W. Trenchard, who will hear the German carpenter's plea, and prosecution and defence officials. Attorney General Davis T. Wilmer, chief of New Jersey's prosecuting staff, said after the conference it was likely the date for the trial of Hauptmann, now confined in a Hunterdon County jail cell, would be closed at the time of the arraignment. James M. Pavrett, the carpenter's attorney, said he had expressed to officials a desire the trial itself be set for Dec. 11, but added he would accept the decision of Wilmer and Hunterdon County Judge Anthony M. Hanck. Previously, Wilmer had indicated the trial would start shortly after the elections Nov. 6.

King Presides At Ceremony

(C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) CAMBRIDGE, England, Oct. 22.—Cambridge University's new storey library building was inaugurated today in a ceremony presided over by the King. Stanley Baldwin, Chancellor of the University, received the royal party and delivered a brief address of welcome which was followed by an address in which the King said: "I am glad to be with you and to express my appreciation of all that has been done to provide this wonderful home for the library of Cambridge University. The vision, faith and enterprise of those who conceived this great idea have been abundantly justified in the long history of your University there have been many notable gifts, but the traditions of the past have been equalled or excelled by the generosity and public spirit manifested in our own day." Taking note of the fact that money had been contributed toward the construction of the £2,500,000 edifice from the United States the King said: "The magnificent gift from the international education board reminds us not only that there are special ties of friendship and kinship between this country and the United States, but also that education knows no national frontiers. The pursuit of knowledge draws together the people of the world in a fellowship of cooperative effort." Present was United States Ambassador Robert W. Bingham, who was awarded an honorary degree after the King had spoken.
