

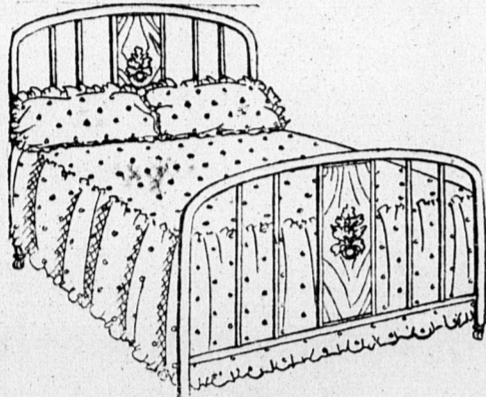

Japs Determined To Drive Chinese Back

TOEYO, Feb. 16.—(A.P.)—Minister of War Sadio Araki said tonight it might be necessary to send still more troop reinforcements to Shanghai. The war minister explained that he had received reports indicating the Chinese army was preparing to put up a stubborn fight. The British, United States and French ambassadors conferred with foreign Minister Kenkichi Yoshizawa at his request and it was understood they were informed of the reasons why Japan has sent thousands of troops to Shanghai. M. Yoshizawa also explained, it was understood, why Japan considered it necessary to drive the Chinese army back "a safe distance" from Shanghai in the event the Chinese refuse to withdraw voluntarily.

Would Give Relief Through Public Works

(Associated Press)

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 16.—Brushing aside the Democratic substitute, the United States Senate today cleared the way for a clean cut vote tomorrow on the LaFollette-Costigan plan for direct federal aid to the needy.

The Democratic bill, sponsored by party leaders, was knocked down by a 48 to 31 vote. Designed to avoid direct relief, it proposed an appropriation of \$750,000,000 to be divided equally between road construction and loans to the states.

The LaFollette-Costigan bill carries the same amount and has the same provision for road construction but would authorize gifts to the states.

Several other substitute and compromise bills were defeated or withdrawn. These included a \$375,000,000 plan offered by Senator Hatfield, Republican, West Virginia, of which \$100,000,000 would have been used for public works.

building will mean an expenditure of probably three hundred thousand dollars, involving thereby a very considerable addition to our public debt.

And yet if we wanted to build in some rural section of the Province a single class room to accommodate from thirty to forty pupils a couple of thousand dollars would probably be considered ample for the job.

Quantity production is supposed to involve lower costs. Why then when we want a dozen class rooms at once should it be necessary to talk immediately in quarter millions.

My own opinion, and I know that some practical people throughout the Province are of like mind, is that a creditable administration building for Prince of Wales—college, university or high school—with three or four class rooms, of completely modern fire-proof construction, with heating plant in the basement or in separate small building could be completed for sixty thousand dollars.

At one side of the administration building, with covered passage way to connect it if necessary, a one and a half or two story building with the four class rooms of the Normal school on one floor and Assembly Hall to seat five hundred on the other floor could be built of frame construction for twenty thousand dollars.

A corresponding frame building at the other side of the administration building with the other seven or eight class rooms necessary could be built for another twenty thousand—a total for say sixteen class rooms and assembly hall for a hundred thousand dollars.

The group of buildings might well be designed to present at least a better appearance than most of these modern barn or factory like structures that we see much of in these later days, the fire risk would certainly be less, the insurance rate should be lower, and up-keep costs no greater than the experience of recently constructed brick buildings in this vicinity.

And in periods of prosperity when some new vocational feature or educational stunt was to be tried out a separate building therefore could be quickly supplied.

I would like later, perhaps, to say something about Falconwood and road expenditures in another letter, but in the meantime would like to hear opinions from some of your other readers.

Chinese Protest At Japs Base Operations

NANKING, China, Feb. 16.—(A.P.)—China again protested today against Japan's use of the International settlement in Shanghai "as a base for operations against the Chinese."

The National Government informed Great Britain and the United States that in view of the situation it would have to act in self-defence and could not assume responsibility for any "damage caused life and property within the settlement as a result of this action."

It previously had protested to the British and United States governments against the continued landing of Japanese troops in the settlement, charging that it constituted a violation of the settlement's neutrality. Its notes said the Japanese had landed 20,000 soldiers in the settlement within the last two days, "which is a clear indication of Japanese defiance of the powers' advice to Japan not to use the settlement as a base for operations and as a place affording facilities for Japanese convenience."

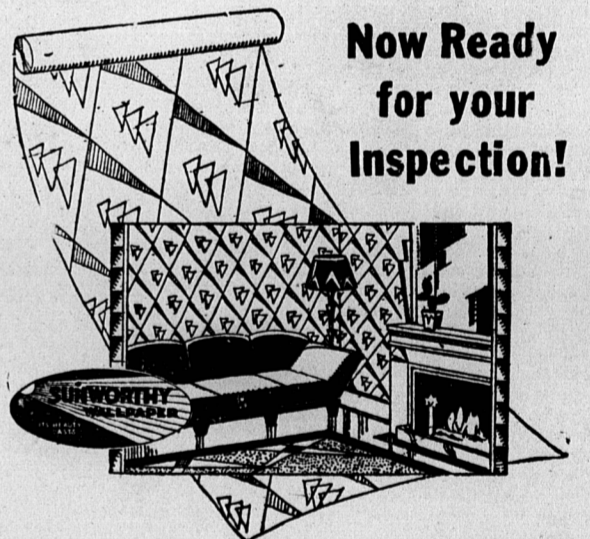
