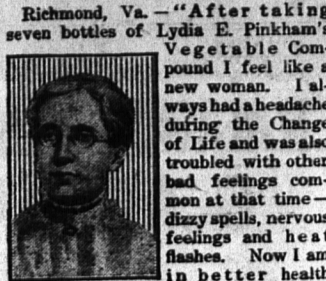

supervision of the Road Master of the District?

Have these parties made a claim upon the Commissioner of Public Works or upon the Government for pay for their labour? Have they been paid, and if so, how much? And when, if not yet paid, is it the intention of the Government to pay them?

6. Mr. Lea gives notice that he will ask the Commissioner of Public Works to lay on the table of the House a detailed statement of what road tax, horse tax and dog tax were collected by George A. Bowness, Road Master of Beauce, in Lot 26, during the year 1915, and by whom paid? Also what moneys were expended by said Road Master in his Road District, during that year, also when, to whom, and for what purpose, such moneys were expended?

7. Mr. Lea gives notice that he will ask the Commissioner of Public Works to lay on the table of the House a detailed statement of what road tax, horse tax and dog tax were collected by Thomas McNeill, Road Master, in Tryon School District, Lot 28, during the year 1915, and by whom paid? Also what moneys were expended in said Road Master's district, and when, and to whom, and for what purpose such moneys were expended?

8. Mr. Bell gives notice that he will ask the Leader of the Government to lay on the table of the House a statement showing:—

Resolved: That it is expedient to appoint a committee of this House to prepare a memorial, addressed to the Minister of Marine and Fisheries, requesting his consideration of the matters above referred to and that such action be taken, as will effectually meet the requirements of this great industry.

Whereas the Federal Department of Fisheries has a number of fishing protection cruisers, patrolling the waters of Canada, which with little expense, could furnish valuable information on the habits and movements of the different fish which inhabit our waters.
