WINNIPEG, Man., Feb. 24.—Erick Braund, a fifteen year old high school boy is in line for the Carnegie medal. While returning home from school yesterday, he heard shouts coming from children on the bank of the Assiniboine river. He hurried over and learned that eleven year old Marjorie Graham, formerly of Montreal, had fallen into the air hole. She was under the ice by the time he arrived, Braund plunged into the icy waters, swam fifteen feet under the ice to the benumbed girl, struggled back with his burden to the air hole and was helped to safety. Marjorie Graham's father is home and was overjoyed at the news. Her mother is in Montreal, attending her father's funeral. With becoming modesty, young Braund remarked today: "I did not do anything which any boy would not have done."

GIRLS ASK TO BE RID OF SMOKING HABIT

NEW YORK, Feb. 23.—The war against the cigarette is going to be carried into the public schools, if Mrs. Jennie Hobson Milligen, State Superintendent of the Anti-cigarette league, can get permission from the Board of Education. She is going to call upon the board as soon as possible and ask them to permit her and several physicians to visit "public schools after hours and point with silver nitrate the throats of little boys and girls, who ask for the treatment."

In a statement made public today Mrs. Milligen said that she had talked with many school principals, and those who did not smoke themselves were anxious to co-operate with her. The women principals especially begged her to come and save the boys from the smoking habit that was ruining their scholarship and morals.

In the meantime the work is being carried on at Mrs. Milligen's home. Every Friday evening there is a meeting of the Million Club, as the anti-cigareters are called and children are given a New Jersey Judge. "There are a few girls who come to me too," said Mrs. Milligen. "They are always terribly ashamed but they say they have learned to smoke from some older girls and now they can't get rid of the habit."

JUBILEE EXHIBITION PLANS PROGRESSING.

LONDON, Feb. 23.—Mr. Leonard Palmer, initiator of the project for a Canadian Jubilee Exhibition in 1917, returns to Canada on Saturday, after enlisting the cordial co-operation of official circles and leading manufacturers here and in the various Dominions. It is widely felt here that an imperial project of this character, if in Lord Strathcona's words was made "really worthy of Canada's high position in the world," must greatly help to re-establish her in the British public. Mr. Palmer says in a foremost place in the confidence it only remains now to complete the details of the scheme under Canadian direction.

TWO RAPHEAL PICTURES DISCOVERED IN NAPLES

NAPLES, Feb. 23.—Two pictures by Raphael, hitherto attributed to "Peruzino's pupil," have been discovered in the National Museum here by the Director, Professor Vittorio Spinazzola. The two pictures represent the Virgin Mary and St. Joseph, and were originally painted for the Church of St. Augustine at Città di Castello. They were taken by the French during the Napoleonic epoch, but were left in the French Church of St. Louis at Rome, whence the King of Naples rescued them after the restoration.

Professor Spinazzola's find is considered a great artistic discovery. He says the pictures are youthful products of Raphael, and are most rare. Raphael was a pupil of Pietro Vannucci Peruzino.
