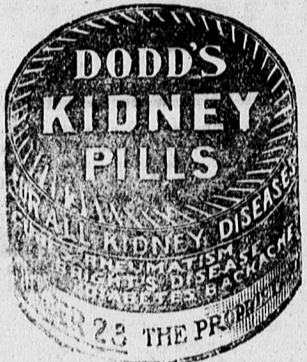


SUMMERSIDE, ALBERTON and PRINCE COUNTY

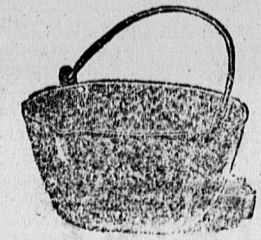
