WHOLE WHEAT GINGER-BREAD

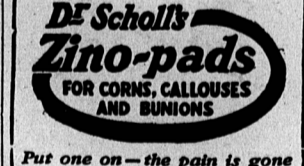
4 tablespoons sugar, 1/2 cup shortening, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon soda, 1/2 cup milk (soda), 1 cup flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 3 tablespoons chopped and candied lemon peel, 2 whole wheat flour, 1/2 cup Sun-Maid seeded raisins, 1 1/2 cups molasses, 1/2 cup chopped nut meats, 1/2 teaspoon powdered mace, 1/2 teaspoon powdered cinnamon.
Mix the white and whole wheat flour, add peel, raisins, nuts, spices and salt. Melt shortening, molasses and sugar, then cool and add them with eggs well beaten with soda mixed with milk. Mix well and turn into greased and floured cake tin. Bake in moderate oven one hour. Sufficient for one large cake of gingerbread.

CAN SAWDUST BE USED AS FUEL?

To a thoughtful man the sight of one of those large incinerators which are the most prominent features of so many Canadian lumber mills invariably conveys the impression of willful waste. The fact that much more than a million tons of sawdust are destroyed in such appliances every year is surely something to think about. But what else can be done with it? Fifty uses might be named but none of them would account for more than the smallest fraction of the whole amount of sawdust produced. The most important raw material of industry is fuel and it is as fuel that sawdust may become useful. The problems connected with the utilization of sawdust as fuel are somewhat similar to those presented the use of lignite and for this reason the Forest Products Laboratory of Canada of the Department of the Interior are watching with interest the work of the Department of Mines in the hope that it may throw some light upon the problem of the use of sawdust in briquette form. The present time, when fuel is so hard to get, would seem a propitious opportunity for such research and the Laboratories are anxious to be able to give an encouraging reply to the oft repeated enquiry—How can we utilize our sawdust?

CURRIED LAMB WITH RAISINS

1 pound lamb, 3 cups boiling salted water, 1 slice onion, 1 stalk celery, 2 cups hot cooked rice 1/2 cup flour, 1/2 cup cold water 1/2 teaspoon curry, 1 cup Sun-Maid raisins.
Cut lamb in cubes. Add water, onion and celery and boil 5 minutes. Reduce heat and cook until meat is tender. Add raisins. Mix flour and curry with cold water and add slowly to hot mixture, stirring constantly Cook 15 minutes, stirring frequently. Arrange border of hot rice on warm platter and put meat in center. Serve at once.

TURKISH SULTAN AT MALTA ON A BRITISH FLAGSHIP

MALTA, Nov. 25.—The British dreadnought Malaya with Sultan Mohammed VI. on board, arrived here this morning.
Since the Sultan is travelling incognito, the customary honors and salutes were dispensed with. It is expected that Governor Plumer will board the vessel to extend an official welcome. Mohammed, who is accompanied by his ten-year-old son and three officials, will stay at Fort Tigne, which has been specially prepared for his reception.

ILLNESS CHEAP IN PRAGUE

According to a consular report, one may at least be ill in Austria and not dread the exorbitant doctor's bill that follows.
The city of Prague, with a population of about 600,000, has only about 800 physicians. A doctor charges for a day-time call in a middle class family only 60 cents or 10 cents more than if the patient calls on him in his office. For a night call the doctor receives from 1.20 to \$2, according to the distance. Only professors at the clinics of the two local universities charge more, receiving \$2 to \$4 for a house call and 2 for an office visit. As in this country, the physicians give only prescriptions.
About 100 dentists practice in Prague. The average charges are: Drawing one tooth, 40 cents; cement filling, 60 cents to \$1; amalgam filling, 80 cents to \$2.
The annual income of these professional men is estimated as follows: Head professor in charge of clinics, salary paid by the government, \$1,440 to \$1,600, and \$5,000 to \$11,000 from private practice; other professors at clinics, salary paid by the government, \$1,000 and from private practice, \$4,000 to \$10,000; general medical practitioner not attached to any clinic, \$3,000 to \$3,500, the average income of a dentist being \$5,000.

MAY APPOINT TO SENATE U. S. MINISTER AT TOKIO

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—Appointment of Charles B. Warren, Ambassador to Japan, as United States Senator from Michigan, to succeed Truman H. Newberry, resigned, would not be surprising to Mr. Warren's friends here, as it has been rumored for several months that Mr. Warren contemplated giving up his post in Tokio.

HEAVY SNOWS IN QUEBEC HOLD UP LEGISLATORS

QUEBEC, Nov. 25.—There was a very slim attendance at the meeting of the Quebec Legislative Assembly this afternoon; only eighteen members and three Ministers were in their seats when the House was called to order. The heavy snow storm which has been raging here for the past 24 hours caused some delay in the train service, and some of the country members did not reach the city until late in the afternoon.

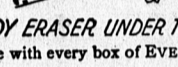

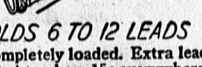

HOW TO AVOID TUBERCULOSIS
