The noise of the explosion was heard by his mother who immediately sent for Dr. Solomon, who dressed the wound which was very painful. The little girl escaped unharmed. Burton Clark, Jas. Clark, Old Harry, Norman Richards, Freeman Lohnes and Simeon Clarke, Grosse Laine, have returned home from a few days' business trip to Grindstone. Prof. A. L. Marcou, Souris, who was at Grindstone tuning pianos and repairing watches and clocks left Wednesday for Etang-Du-Nord. Willson Schenel, Souris, who is at present working at Grindstone, received a cheque of \$10.00 by last mail as recognition of services rendered in saving the crew of the schooner North America which was wrecked in Souris harbor last December. It will be remembered that Mr. Wilson, with a number of others, started out in a dory in an endeavor to save the crew who were in danger of perishing. The recognition of the brave efforts of Mr. Schenel and his companions, on that memorable night, by the lifesaving department is very commendable.

OTTAWA, Aug. 2—With the object of bringing about provincial reciprocity in the practice of medicine throughout the Dominion, Hon. Dr. Roche, secretary of State, will, at an early date, call a meeting of the provincial medical board representatives to perfect plans for carrying out the work of the new Dominion board.

For many years there has been considerable agitation for the bringing into force of an act providing for a Dominion medical council to provide that certificates of registration procured in any province of the Dominion would be good in any other province. In the past, physicians registered in Ontario could not practice in Quebec, and vice versa, the same holding good in all the provinces. An act was passed in the session of 1911 providing for the creation of a medical council of Canada. Its object was the establishment of a qualification in medicine which would enable holders to practice in all the provinces of the Dominion. This council was to be made up of one member from each province, to be appointed by the governor-general-in-council, an additional number of members from each province being according to the number of practitioners in each province. The council further aimed at the establishment of such status of the medical profession should ensure recognition from the United Kingdom and enable Canadian doctors to acquire the right of registration under imperial acts. It is in order that the act may have the approval of legislation from all the provinces that Hon. Dr. Roche has called the meeting referred to.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Subagency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$300 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each year on the land. Price \$150 per acre and erect a house worth \$250.00.
