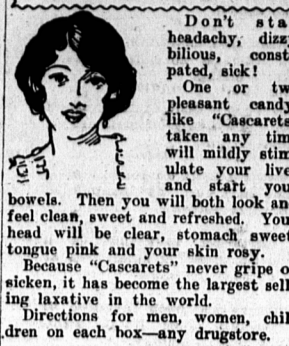

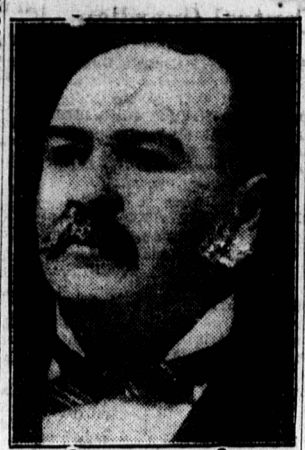

Most people don't talk about sad cakes—they throw them into the garbage can, hurriedly and surreptitiously. Only domestic science experts talk about sadness because they wish to banish this plague from every kitchen. The staff of the Sunland Service Laboratories recently discovered some interesting things about this phase of baking in the course of research work for the Sun-Maid Raisin Growers of California.

Sadness, as applied to cakes, is heaviness, softness, lack of grain. The word derives from the Old English "Sad" meaning sated, tired, firm, and is akin to the Latin "Sat," signifying enough. Exact as regards cake and smoothing irons, the word now refers only to mental and spiritual qualities, but even there it still seems to point a finger of scorn at a fallen cake, the dictionary defining sad, as "afflictive, calamitous, inspiring melancholy." Many housewives will recognize this definition immediately.

Sunland Service Laboratories say that most frequent cause of sadness is improper baking. Cake should be started at a low temperature, but the heat should be increased as soon as the mixture has risen. To understand the principle of this thoroughly, housewives should bear in mind that a successful cake must have time to rise, due to the formation of gas from the action of baking powder, yeast or soda. As soon as the mixture has risen, however, the heat must be increased to stiffen the cells walls composed of flour and eggs so that the gas will not escape. If the cake cooks too slowly, the cell walls are not stiffened fast enough and the cake will fall, never to rise again.

Moisture is another factor in sadness. So is fat. Milk, water and fat make the cell walls of a cake tender and palatable. If there is too much moisture or fat, or if the cake cooks too slowly, the cell walls before they are fixed by heat, then the cake is a failure. All recipes should be followed exactly because they have been tested until domestic science experts are satisfied they represent the surest and best results.
