**THE EXHIBITION.**

This afternoon the Interprovincial Exhibition will be opened by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor. Our people have always been appreciative of the advantages which such displays confer and have shown their interest by their attendance. Probably in no other Province of the Dominion has so large a proportion of the total population gathered together from year to year to witness the display of our varied products as on these occasions gather in Prince Edward Island. The density of our population and abundant facilities for communication between all parts of the Island and this city alike tend to bring a good attendance. And there is good reason to hope and believe that with favorable weather conditions during the few days to come the best records of attendance may be equalled if not exceeded.

The large list of entries in the various classes is indicative of strong popular interest. It has usually been found that the attendance sustains a regular proportion to the number of exhibitors, and if so we may have good hopes for the success of this year's show, with its many and varied attractions. And it is the duty of all who can do so to attend. The educative and stimulating effect which an exhibition is designed to produce is wholly lost so far as concerns those who do not see it. If no one attended, the money and effort expended in preparing the display would be wholly wasted. If on the contrary all our adult population could be induced to attend, the entire community would be informed as it never has been in regard to the wealth and resources of the Province and the progress we are making in all the lines of peaceful industry. He is a dull

man indeed who cannot learn something at an exhibition that will many times repay the cost of attendance in actual money value, added to the satisfaction he will have in looking upon the show and meeting friends old and new from all parts of the Province.

Among exhibitors old competitors in field or orchard or dairy products, or in live stock will meet with their rivals of former years; and with new and younger ones who enter the lists for the first time. This feature will be found both pleasurable and stimulating. Those of advanced years will find new zest in life from attending the fair, while those of younger years will find it a world in miniature. Many a man sticks too closely to his farm, his shop or his office. All have need to mix up with their fellows from time to time to extend acquaintance and gather new ideas. "Home keeping youths have ever homely wits," as Shakespeare wrote, and the same may be true of those who are older. Therefore let all who can attend the exhibition do so, and make it what we confidently hope it may be, the largest, the most attractive, instructive and useful of any that has yet been held within the Province.

An Englishman writing to the New York Sun sums up the situation as follows:

You have the cup—your ugly silver bauble—and the "glory" of your toy yacht victory of Sandy Hook. But Old England still holds the mastery of your ocean trade. She has fourteen million tons of deep sea shipping, you less than a million. You cannot move your crops or get your Yankee goods to market without giving rich toll to Liverpool and London. We have driven your clippers off the sea with our steam "tramps"; we have forced your sailors ashore until you had to man your champion yacht with Scandinavians. You save a five hundred dollar trophy and go wild with delight; you pay us for carrying your ocean freight and passengers \$60,000,000 a year. You have the shadow, we have the substance. Why should not we be satisfied if you are?
