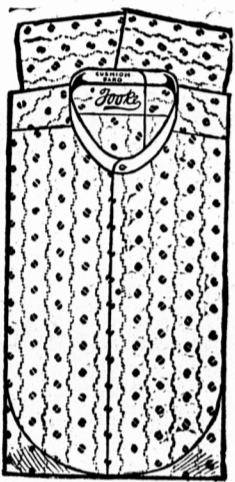
The college student who lost her pocket book was rejoiced to get it so quickly through a Guardian classified ad.

The marriage took place in the Methodist Church, Bideford on Tuesday evening last of the pastor, Rev. Ernest S. Weeks and Miss Rebekah Williams, daughter of the late Albert Williams of Bideford. The bride was attended by Miss Minnie Weeks sister of the groom, with Leon Jewett a divinity student, acting as best man. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. H. Johnson, Summerside. After the ceremony a reception was held at the home of the bride where a number of invited guests were very pleasantly entertained. The bride who is one of Bedoues most popular young ladies was handsomely remembered by her many friends as was shown by the large number of beautiful and costly wedding presents.

A correspondent at Mostou, Sask., sends the following: "Quite a gloom has been cast over this new settlement by the death of Harrison Brien, a native of Victoria, P.E.I., and the youngest son of Angus Brien, a well known business man of that place. The deceased was one of the pioneers of this place, and though barely eighteen years of age when he landed here, his cabin was the second one built in what is now the thriving settlement of Dinsmore. He showed a marked amount of pluck and energy from the start, and was well started in farming, and had he lived three months more would have had his patent. His genial and pleasant ways made him a great favorite in the community. He had many friends and no enemies, which was shown by the large number that came to their last rites. He died at three o'clock June 2, in the new cemetery, which may be said to be one of the beauty spots of Saskatchewan. The deceased contracted typhoid fever a short time ago and though all that was done for him that loving hands could do, or provide, backed by stalwart and powerful physique and strong constitution, nothing could stay the ravages of the fell destroyer, and he passed peacefully away at six o'clock May 31, at the home of his brother William, for whom great sympathy is felt all over the settlement; also for his aged parents so far away, who are left alone, as all their other children are established in homes of their own, away from the island, and to make the case still sadder, Harrison had made all arrangements to go home and live with them as soon as he had obtained his patent. He had just returned from visiting them about a month before he took sick.

On June the fifteenth the residents of South Melville and adjacent districts were greatly pained to learn that a much esteemed neighbor, Mrs. Alexander MacFarlane had departed this life. Although somewhat prepared for the sad news by the very serious turn her illness had taken during the last week, still it came no less a shock to those who knew and loved her so well. For the last number of years she had not been in very robust health, although nothing serious was anticipated and her family had looked forward to spending many long and peaceful years in the enjoyment of her society, but God in his infinite wisdom ordained it otherwise and they humbly bow to His decree. The deceased who was in her sixty-first year, was a woman of estimable character and sterling worth, and was always looked upon as a very model of amiability, those who have known her for years have been heard to remark that they had never once seen her brow sullied by a frown. She was a kind and loving mother and previous to her husband's decease which occurred some eight years ago she was noted as a good and affectionate wife. Her life all through has indeed been one worthy of imitation. During her illness she was attended by her pastor Rev. W. MacLeod of Hampton, having been a fervent member of the Presbyterian church at that place. On Wednesday June the seventeenth her remains were followed to their last resting place in Arctyle Cemetery by an unusually large concourse of people of all denominations thus testifying to the esteem in which she was held. The services at both house and grave were conducted by Rev. W. MacLeod. The bearers who were all nephews of the deceased were George and John D. MacFarlane, John and Philip Beer, Lorne Higgins and Allan Ferguson. She leaves to mourn a large family of sons and daughters consisting of John in Medford, Mass., George, James and Barbara of Boston, Frits Isla of Jamaica Plains, Mrs. Frank Drew of Medford Mass., Mrs. John MacKinnon of Desable, Lillian and Annie at home. All the members of her family were present at the funeral with the exception of the first named and Mrs. Drew. She leaves also three brothers Major Inman of North Tryon, Job Inman of Augustine Cove, James Inman of Victoria. Sisters are Mrs. George Higgins of South Melville, Mrs. George Inman of Alberton, Mrs. Alfred Ferguson of Charlottetown and Mrs. Priscilla Mayer of Jamaica Plains. To all those bereaved ones the community extends heartfelt sympathy.—Com.
