The Mournment Fund Committee had a big task, they recognized the ability of the Director Averill, and he rapidly and skilfully, with his able Lieutenant Mr. Booth, brought out our talent. The dance by Miss Helen Warburton is one of the daintiest and most graceful dances the scribe has ever seen. Iridescent, incomparable, Zephra is immense.

Yesterday the increased rates announced by the Charlottetown Light and Power Company was possibly the most talked of subject. In conversation with some of the patrons it was learned that the increase in some cases means the doubling of the present rates and in consequence estimates are being asked for with a view to the establishment of a new plant operated by some of the largest consumers at the present time. In consequence of this a GUARDIAN representative waited upon the President of the Company to ascertain just what was the cause of the increase. Mr. Longworth said that notices have been issued by the Light and Power Company adjusting the rates, the directors having found that consumers were paying very unequally for the lighting of their premises. As all are aware the price of coal has advanced within two years from \$2.30 a ton to \$4.10 which is the price that the Company is paying for coal this season which he held justifies them in a considerable advance on the price of lighting. They also state that with the advanced rates Charlottetown will still receive much cheaper lights than any of the cities or towns in the Maritime Provinces. For instance the lights in Summerside average \$3.35 per light and the plant closes down at 2 o'clock every morning in the year. The directors are satisfied that they can justify the increase in cost of lighting, when they obtain the exact figures charged in other cities in the lower provinces, which they expect to have in a few days. The increases in some cases have been much larger than in others as some consumers were lighted for less than half price while others were paying fair rates, the result of the companies competing for business. The repairs to the engine in the Royal plant will be completed about Thursday next when they hope to give the patrons an improved light. In a few days the city contract will be made satisfactory to the Council and the citizens.

At a meeting of the Bar Society held in the Law Library yesterday at noon, (10th day of September, 1901.) the following resolution was moved by the Attorney General and seconded by Messrs A. McDonald and unanimously carried:

Resolved that whereas the recent elevation of Sir Louis Henry Davies to the Bench of the Supreme Court of Canada, is a matter of intense satisfaction to the members of this Society, this meeting desires to place on record and express the pleasure and high gratification experienced by its members, at the well merited promotion of so talented and clever a member of this society to that high and responsible position. This feeling is intensified by the fact that this choice was made from our Province and Society when there is so large a field for selection and such a number of the talented members of the legal fraternity to choose from throughout the great Dominion.

The important position taken by him at the outset of his career as counsel on the Fishery Commission and also later in the many other great federal and international questions which have arisen have added lustre not only to his reputation but also to that of the Society of which he was a most illustrious member. This Society feels that he will, in carrying out the duties of his high office, bring to bear on the questions that may come before him that assiduity and thoroughness that has already characterized him as a working and diligent lawyer.

Resolved that the resolution be entered on the minutes of this Society and that a copy thereof be sent to Mr. Justice Davies.
