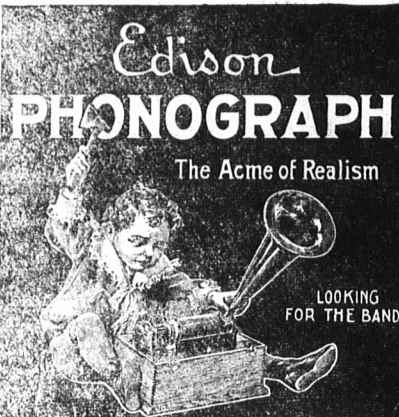

MOVE TO PUNISH ELECTION FRAUDS

NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—The movement to punish election frauds in New York city was augmented today by the Citizens' Union, which took steps to prosecute those who violated the law last Tuesday. The avowed object of the Citizens' Union is to secure a new election law for the state.

The Citizens' Union announced that after showing in court the corruption which is found under the present law it would attempt to have the New York legislature adopt a ballot law similar to the one now in use in Massachusetts.

The New York law was criticized as follows: Satisfactory as the present law is in the general situation by guarding the voter by making the vote secret, the existing law utterly fails in its purpose of giving the voter freedom of choice among the candidates nominated.
