GOD GRANT CONSCRIPTION CARRIES IN THE ELECTION DECLARES HUGH GUTHRIE

Striking Pronouncement of One of the Leading Liberals of Ontario

TORONTO.—The one striking thing which stood out above all others at the meeting in the Arena was the intense earnestness which seemed evidenced on every hand—in the speeches that were delivered and in the faces that made up the audience which heard them.

Never since the first outbreak of war has a Toronto audience seemed more anxious to encourage her statesmen and men of affairs to newer deeds of enterprise or more valiant initiative. As the meeting got under way and speech succeeded speech it became evident that the huge crowd of 5,000 was but waiting for an opportune moment to express itself.

When Lieut. Col. E. P. Hardy of the Great War Veterans said the word "Conscription" for the first time in the initial address the applause was deafening. And when he asked the audience "are we going to wait until the German hordes invade our very shores?" a tremendous "no" broke like a tidal wave in answer to the question.

One of the most outstanding features of the meeting was the sympathetic way in which the audience listened to and applauded every speaker who spoke on behalf of the great war veterans association. It seemed to find kindling fervor in the speakers themselves and the speech delivered by those who had seen the fighting seemed to increase in earnest forcefulness with each succeeding speaker.

The spirit seemed infectious, and as speech followed speech the one dominating thought which may have occurred to many present was "Canada may once more find herself and go afresh to the fray."

WAR-SCARRED VETERANS.

There were other incidents which seemed to bring the war home in all its grim reality and hideousness and many an eye was glistening as maimed and crippled soldiers who had expressed the wish to be present were borne by willing comrades to their appointed seats near the platform.

By James Cobourg Hodgins

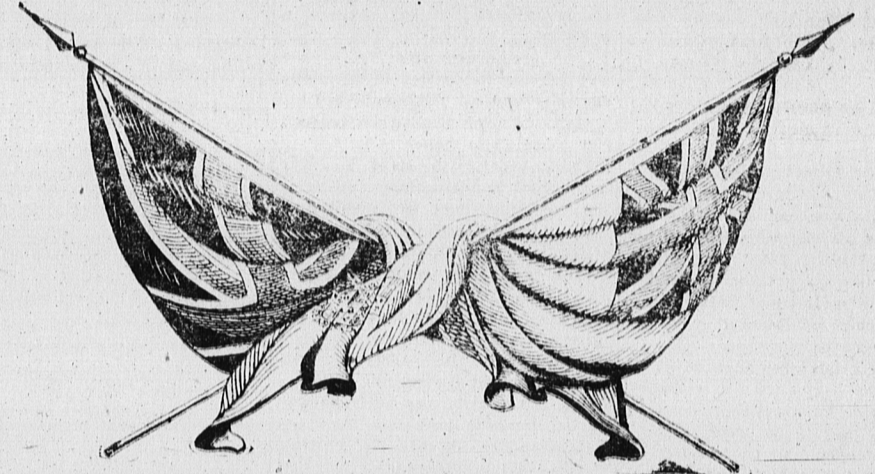
To those who went, the dearest name on earth,
