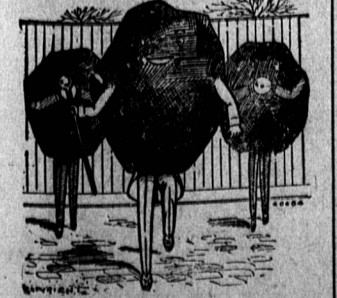

The teachers are all reappointed as follows: Principal Mr. E. D. Feehan; Vice Principal—Miss Mabel McIntosh, B. A.; Assistants—Misses Ethel McEwen and Mary Walsh."

"THE S. S. LADY SYBIL docked at Souris at 9 p. m. Monday being delayed on account of the special trip for the militia in the morning. She landed 1 car load of flour and 1 car load of hay freight. Her outward cargo consisted of fourteen hundred mackerel barrels and 2 car loads of freight, she sailed at 2 a. m. Tuesday for the Magdalen Islands."

"EASTERN NOTES.—The lobster season opened late, but for a few weeks the fishermen of the north side did well, then the storms came, destroying the traps and dispersing the fish, and for the last two weeks comparatively few have been caught. The lobsters have been scarce on the south side during the entire season. Cod fish came late, and continued poor, and at present it looks as if the cod fishing is going to be nearly a failure. For four years now the usual body of cod fish appears to have deserted the Gulf. The veteran fishermen of Red Point and Basin Head worked hard all the spring for very meagre results, but on the morning of the 19th their spirits were cheered by a considerable quantity of mackerel in other nets, but on the other hand it looks as if prices would rule low this season. The present outlook is, that the natural increase of these beautiful fish has after a number of years gone ahead of the purse seine, numbers of which were put out of business for want of fish to seine, and if some restrictive legislation as to their use were agreed between the Dominion and United States authorities they would again swarm in our waters and be a source of wealth to our province, employment to our citizens and sport to our tourists. From the unusual climatic conditions much sickness still prevails through the country."
