**MARITIME BOARD OF TRADE.**—The Maritime Board of Trade will meet this year in Moncton, August 20th. The subjects which have been sent in for discussing to date are: Maritime Union; Closer relation between employers and employed; Better transportation facilities, including water, air and rail for the Maritime Provinces. Development of National Ports on the Atlantic coast; Development of Water Power; War memorials; Revision of Freight Rates that discriminate against the Lower Provinces; Necessity for adoption of Unit System of Management of Canadian National Railways, with headquarters for the Eastern unit in the Lower Provinces.

The intelligence of the pig-tailed macaque of the Malays is made use of by the natives to do various useful tasks. The monkey on a long cord is led to a cocoanut tree, which it rapidly ascends. It then lays hold of a nut, and if the owner judges the fruit to be ripe for ducking he shouts to the monkey, which then twists the nut round and round till the stalk is broken and lets it fall to the ground. If the monkey catches hold of an unripe fruit, the owner tugs the cord and the monkey tries another.

**THE HORSE MANURE PILE FIRE-FANGING**

When horse manure is left in a loose and open pile the air works in, dries out the manure and starts a strong fermentation. This results in what is known as "fire-fanging." In this condition the manure heats to a very high temperature, becomes very

dry and takes on a light color. During this process a quantity of the nitrogen is lost, being burned away by the high heat. When the manure however, is stamped down hard and well soaked with water, this fire-fanging does not occur, as the air cannot work in freely. Under these conditions of moisture and a compact pile the manure decays instead of burning, and thus becomes more available as a plant food. The best way to hold such manure is to stamp it down hard and firmly and see that it is kept moist by using much water on it. If the liquid from the stable can be poured over the pile this would make an ideal practice, but keep the pile firmly compact so as to keep out an excess of air. Manures handled in this way will carry through the winter nicely. In order to make it more effective there may be added 40 pounds of acid phosphate to each ten of manure. This should be scattered all through the pile and acid needed phosphorus to the manure, and also make a chemical combination to hold the ammonia. Handled in this way you will have a very good product.
