THE funeral of the late F. C. Rattray took place yesterday afternoon to People's Cemetery and was largely attended, the Oddfellows and Masons with the 4th Regiment Band attending in bodies. It will be remembered that the deceased died suddenly at Portland, Me., after an operation for appendicitis, blood poisoning having set in.

PROHIBITION summonses have been served on Patrick Doherty, Augustus Alyworth and Francis McKenna, Queen Street, for third, second, and first offences respectively. They are returnable on Monday. Cases come up for hearing at Police Court to-day against Alfred Downing, Angus DesRoches, Andrew Doyle and Peter Benoit.

The death occurred at East Boston on November 16th of Mrs. William McKie. Deceased was a daughter of the late Richard Bourke of Souris. She leaves to mourn a husband one son and four daughters in Boston, and in the Island, an aged mother and four sisters, Mrs. William Brehaut, Charlottetown, Mrs. Thomas Kickham, Mrs. J. G. Sterns and Mrs. Peter Stewart all of Souris.

A Montreal dispatch says.—It is understood that John Pitblado, Manager of the Montreal Branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia has resigned and as soon as the directors act he will begin business here as a stock broker, a seat on the Exchange having already been purchased for \$25,000.—Mr Pitblado was manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia here a few years ago and is well known by business men and others of the city.

The firemen were called out yesterday afternoon shortly after five o'clock for a slight blaze in the stable of F. W. Hyndman on Kent Street east. The wall of the stable was ignited by an electric wire forming a short circuit but no more damage was done than the charring of the wall and the burning of a coat. The fire was extinguished before the firemen arrived on the scene.

The Moncton Transcript refers in very complimentary terms to the politeness and general courtesy of the conductors on the P. E. Island Railway, whom it says are gentlemen in every sense of the term, and special reference is made to Conductors John McDonald, Frank Kelly, Daniel McKenna with whom it came more especially in contact all of whom are said to be faithful and obliging public servants.

CAPT. T. G. TAYLOR, of the Gunbars, which has been recently purchased by the Dominion Government will retain his position as commander of that ship. With the vast experience and well-known ability of the Captain, no better selection could be made. Capt. Taylor first went to sea in 1871 and in 1878 had risen to the rank of master. He first commanded the Minnie Curmichael, owned and sailed by Welsh & Owen. Up to 1893, when he was first appointed to the Gunbars, then in the surveying service, Capt. Taylor sailed as master of different vessels including his own, in the Pacific and Atlantic, making voyages to the East Indies, China, Australia, Chili, Peru and Africa.

A recent issue of the Salt Lake Herald says: "Colonel Matt A. Daugherty, manager of the Spring Valley Oil & Pipe Line Company's Wyoming properties, returned from a two weeks' trip to Cleveland, O., after having been in conference with the directors of the company. He reports that arrangements have been made for an active campaign of development and operations will be under the immediate charge of Fred Clark of Cleveland, who came out with him in order to supervise work in the field. Mr. Daugherty says that another well has just been brought over at Spring Valley and he has no doubt that a few months more will see big geyters on in the oil regions. He says, also, that a move is now on foot for the erection of oil refineries in this city or vicinity, where, all the operators agree they should be located." Fred Clark referred to above is a son of J. B. L. Clark (who by the way is Sec'y-Treas. of the Company) formerly of Summerside and now residing in Cleveland, O.
