INTENSE INDIGNATION OVER POLICE SYSTEM IN NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, Aug. 15.—A resolution expressing the determination of the citizens of New York to rid the police force system of graft and blackmail was given forcible expression tonight at a mass meeting held in the historic hall of the Cooper Union. The meeting appointed a vigilance committee of prominent men and women to see that public officers engaged in exposing treasonable alliance on the part of the police with organized crime do their best. The mass meeting which showed the public indignation aroused over the revelations of police corruption growing out of the murder of Herman Rosenthal was attended by a crowd which overflowed the hall. There were 4,000 in the auditorium and hundreds standing up, blocking the streets outside and thousands more were clamoring for admittance. It was the largest "town meeting" held for years, and there was no mistaking the earnestness which pervaded the gathering and voiced approval of the denunciation of the police "system."

Charged with instigating the murder of Rosenthal Breckers denied to his counsel today that he had ever possessed the sum of \$58,845 credited to his name or that of his wife in various New York banks. District Attorney Whitman today obtained from the officials of Chelsea Exchange Bank records showing that the police officer had deposited \$3,500 in that institution during April, bringing the recorded total of Breckers' deposit up to \$62,345.

HAMILTON DEATH A MYSTERY.

HAMILTON, Ont., Aug. 15.—In connection with the mysterious death of Rose E. Ziele at the City Hospital a new feature has developed which tends to deepen the mystery. It is that Mrs. Bruce, wife of the man detained by the police, and two other girls who ate of the same candy as the deceased showed no signs of illness, but stomach pumps were used merely as a precautionary measure. Under the circumstances the cause of death is likely to remain a mystery until the analysis of the contents of the stomach is completed.

PREMIER BOTHA IS HONORED BY KING GEORGE

HARVEST EXCURSIONIST KILLED AT FRANKTOWN.

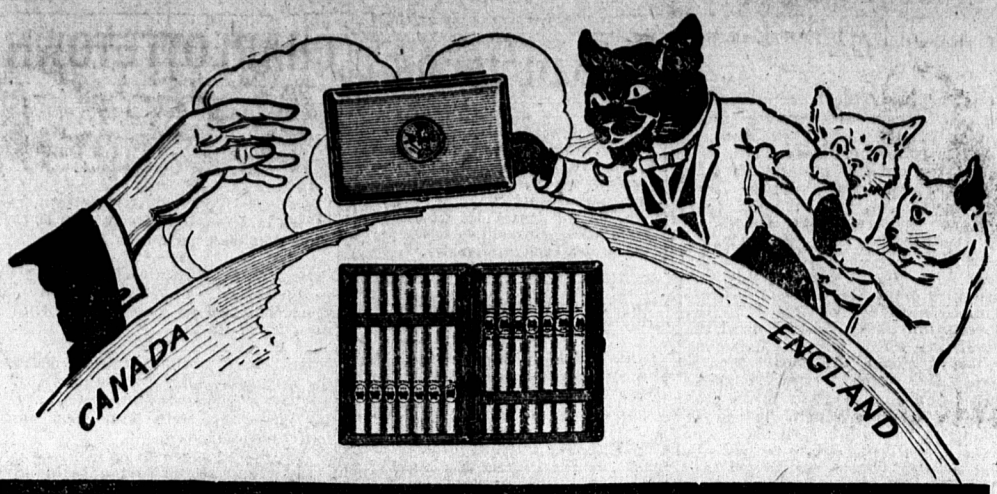
SMITH FALLS, Ont., August 14.—W. E. Reynolds, of St. John, was instantly killed at Franktown, about twelve miles from here last night. Reynolds had a ticket for Vancouver on the harvest excursion train, which had the siding at Franktown to wait for the local from Ottawa. The young fellow stepped off the train and presumably failed to notice the local, which ran into him. The train was slowing down at the time and rolled him under the cow-catcher. He was put in the baggage car of the local and Dr. Anderson notified to meet the train here, but Reynolds died almost at the stopping of the train at this station. His head was badly mutilated. His relatives at St. John were notified and an inquest was ordered this afternoon. The young fellow was about twenty-three years of age, well dressed and wore an Oddfellows' locket.

DEMOCRATS REBUDE.

WASHINGTON, August 14.—After a fight extending over many weeks, democrats to the house today agree in caucus to recede from their "no battleship champions to vote in the house for one such vessel. Unlike the absence of bitterness of feeling and by a rising vote of 95 to 11 the resolution of recession was put thru. It is expected that the senate will agree to the one battleship, ending the deadlock over the naval bill. There were present in the secret meeting 128 members, representing all opinions on the subject of appropriating for naval expansion, and of these twenty refrained from voting. While the solid majority will not be given to the battleship program the leaders are confident that they will have far more than the necessary strength when aligned with the republican "friends of the navy."

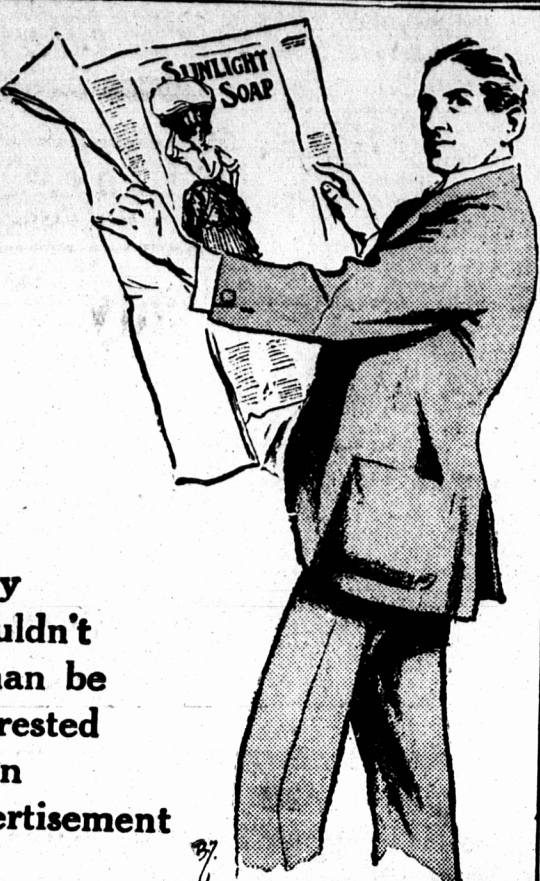
