LONDON, Feb. 2 - (CP) - Approximately 800 Allied prisoners of war held by Japan in three camps near the port of Hakodate, at the southern point of Hokkaido Island, are being given adequate shelter and medical aid and are allowed to raise their own meat and vegetables, an official report said today.

The prisoners of war have factories at each camp, and some Red Cross supplies are reaching the captives, most of whom are British, captured in Java and Singapore.

Reports Of Nazi Inner Fortress Deemed Unlikely

Princess Juliana is Mother First, Princess Second

OTTAWA, Feb. 2 - (CP) - Princess Juliana of the Netherlands is a mother first and a princess second.

Her affection for her three small daughters is complemented by her concern for the people and her anxiety about their welfare in the Netherlands and in the East Indies.

"And when the war with Germany is over our country will have to fight again and very actively," she told a press conference at her wartime home here.

Sitting on the window seat of her home, Lower-Filled living room she told reporters of her pleasure at seeing her children again - and of her pride in the renewed spirit of The Netherlands people under German occupation.

"The Germans have roused their spirit and the underground work has served to cement friendship," she said. "It gives one great confidence in the future to see them. Everyone has lost at least good friends, if not members of their families, in the reign of terror, but they are keen and they have great constructive spirit."

"They have guts," she summed up, after hesitating for the right word.

"Your Canadian boys have been very good to our people, and they appreciate the presents of ration which have helped fill out their scanty diet, and the parties your boys give for the children."

She agreed that it was quite possible Canadian fighting men in Holland would bring back neither brides to Canada after the war.

It is true the S.S. has been impressed in strength from about 17 divisions to around 30 divisions. But the S.S. is no longer the cream of the army. An event occurred many months ago which transformed the S.S. into something entirely different.

The German army selected to be the core of coming German resistance, only 12 can be trusted. The German divisions - and even these have a high proportion of satellites or impressed soldiers serving in their ranks.

The bulk of the S.S. has been reported on the Eastern, Western and Italian Fronts in recent weeks - everywhere except in the so-called German Maquis. However much they have been saved in the past, they are suffering heavy casualties. They are unlikely to have become at the same time the backbone of the mystical Maquis.

Altogether, therefore, the personal question and its present distribution at the front virtually rule out the S.S. as the last-stand army which is being prepared within the reduct in the heart of Germany.

There are other considerations that also make the story of the long-prepared inner fortress less credible. The preparation of a reduct as distinct from a manufacturing plant is one of the most tricky political and military problems.

The first phase alone would take between two and three years, and even after four years the entire scheme would be nowhere near completion.

It is therefore highly questionable if a prepared reduct exists for the German Army. Most of the evidence so far does not bear out the claim.
