"GET RICH QUICK"

Daring Career of a Famous Swindler.

London Express:—There has just died at Ostend one of the most noted swindlers America has ever produced.

On this side of the ocean, where 'or four years he had been forced to reside, he was known as Mr. Silley. His real name and the one under which he operated in America was Edward Schlesinger.

His crowning piece of swindling was the Franklin Syndicate, which ran what was called a "get rich quick" scheme, which he devised and executed so successfully that within a few months he and his partners realised profits of hundreds of thousands of pounds.

Then the black cloud of the police came upon the bright horizon of the syndicate, and William Miller, the ostensible head of the concern, was arrested, and sent to prison for a term of years.

Through circulars sent broadcast over the country the syndicate announced that it was in a position, through secret inside information, to make most profitable deals on the Stock Market, but that to do so successfully a considerable sum of money was required.

By getting a considerable number to subscribe sums from one pound upwards the promoters stated they could so operate the market that they absolutely guaranteed the subscribers a return of at least 10 per cent a week upon their investments.

At first but few nibbled at the bait. But those few received with weekly regularity 10 per cent upon their invested amount, until in some cases four and five times the originally subscribed sum had been obtained in dividends.

In Boston, one of the syndicate's most fruitful fields, a local newspaper investigated and denounced the concern as a fraud, and succeeded in forcing Miller to return nearly £10,000 he had gathered from the trustful Bostonians.

Then the police of New York took the matter up. The syndicate suspended business. Miller skipped to Canada with part of the funds, but finally returned to New York, and was arrested.

Schlesinger, at the time of Miller's arrest, came to Europe with it, and the greater part of the spoil. At least, that is the version given by Miller, who made a complete confession, in which he said that he was only a tool, and that Schlesinger was the originator and head of the syndicate.

Schlesinger, until last spring, was engaged in bookmaking in France, where the police unearthed a gigantic conspiracy, in which Schlesinger and other bookmakers and jockeys were concerned. The consequence was that they had to cross the French border.

Schlesinger was an inveterate gambler. Gambling was the joy of his life, and his last conscious moments were at a gaming table. He had been playing baccarat at Ostend, and was keeping the bank. He suddenly sank down into his chair, and was carried unconscious to his hotel, where for three days he remained in a comatose state and then died.
