The trim yacht owned by the Armour Bros and W. M. Brehaut is undergoing thorough repairs and will be launched next week.

Mr. Pineau is constructing for Dr. Smallwood a handsome 3 horse power gasoline engine launch which will be ready for the water in several weeks' time. She gives promise of being a beauty.

The fast sailing yacht Mionac, holder of the Hillsboro cup is being renovated and having thorough repairs including new tanswork. She will be launched in a week or two. The repairing is being done by Martin Pineau.

INVITATIONS have been issued for the wedding of Rev. M. A. McKinnon of Park street church and Miss Lillian Vaux, daughter of Dr. Vaux of Toronto. The wedding will take place in Toronto on the 31st of May.—Halifax Herald.

A determined effort is being made in the city to secure sufficient money to build a challenger for the Coronation Cup to race at St. John this summer. It is estimated that a yacht which would be a credit to Charlottetown can be built for \$500. She is to be subscribed for on shares and nearly enough has already been contributed. Any who can do anything to promote the scheme should assist and thus place our province in a foremost place in yachting as it is now in other sport.

A valuable addition to the yachting fleet of Charlottetown will be the Hiawatha which has been recently completed by Martin Pineau for a number of well known young men of this city. The Hiawatha was designed by Mr. Pineau's son in Sydney and she will be without doubt one of the prettiest craft in the Province besides being an admirable pleasure boat and giving promise of much speed. She is 33 feet over all with a water line of 22 feet and a ten foot keel. She will have a fin keel carrying 1200 lbs of metal. There will be a small centre boat six feet long running through the keel. She has a cabin 11 feet long, six feet wide and five feet deep. This will be nicely finished and will furnish accommodation for six people. It is well lighted by port holes with brass finishings. The cockpit is water tight and in case a heavy sea is shipped it can be bailed out without any leakage. The Hiawatha will carry about 400 feet of canvas and her sails are being made by John Worth. She will be launched in about a week's time. It is expected that the Hiawatha will take part in the yacht race at Summerside during the Home Comers' week as well as the races in Souris and other contests during the summer.

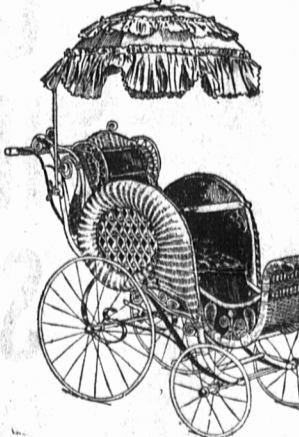
