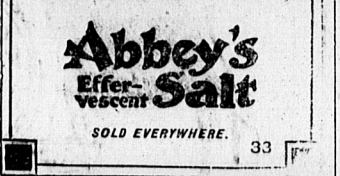

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or of any male over 18 years of age, may locate a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

Duties - Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties - Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate five acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
