EXCITEMENT INCREASES OVER CHURCH-STATE FIGHT

The Papal Nuncio Expelled Escorted to Frontier by Police--Prosecutions Begun Against Abbes--The Expulsion Denounced in Rome

PARIS, Dec. 11.-(Special)-After the Cabinet met to-day it was announced that on Dec. 14 Premier Clemenceau will ask parliament to suppress the pension of the clergy, to liquidate the public property of Catholics, and to distribute parishes, and so on.
